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1.0 An Introduction

The Sports Authority of India (SAI) was set up as a society registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860, in pursuance of Resolution No. 1-1/83/SAI dated January 25, 1984, to carry forward the legacy of the IXth Asian Games held in New Delhi in 1982, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS). SAI has been entrusted with the twin objectives of promoting sports and achieving sporting excellence at the national and international levels.

Subsequently, to facilitate the development of SAI as a robust sports promotion body, necessary knowledge and skills in the field of sports coaching and physical education were incorporated by amalgamating the erstwhile Society for National Institutes of Physical Education & Sports (SNIPES), consisting of Netaji Subhash National Institute for Sports (NSNIS), Patiala, and its centres along with two other educational institutes, namely, Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE) located in Gwalior and Thiruvananthapuram, with SAI effective from May 1, 1987. However, LNCPE, Gwalior, was delinked from SAI in September 1995 upon attaining the status of a "Deemed University." Today, SAI stands out as an apex body for the promotion of sports and sporting excellence in the country.

1.2 General Body & Governing Body of SAI

As per the Memorandum of Association and Rules of SAI, the General Body (Society) and the Governing Body of SAI are constituted by the Government of India. The General Body was reconstituted by the Department of Sports, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, on 16th November 2022, and the Governing Body of SAI was reconstituted on 1st September 2023. The Hon'ble Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports heads the General Body and Governing Body of SAI as its Chairman.

Presently, the constitution of the General Body of SAI consists of 36 members (including the President). The term of the members (except Ex-Officio Members) is for a period of three years from the date of their nomination. The Governing Body of SAI has 28 members (including its Chairman). The term of the members (except Ex-Officio Members) is for a period of three years from the date of their nomination.

During the year 2023-24, the 58th and 59th meetings of the Governing Body of SAI were held on 19th September 2023 and 20th February 2024, respectively. The minutes of the Governing Body meetings are provided at Annexure – I and Annexure – II, respectively.

1.3 Aims and Objectives


The Aims & Objectives of SAI are given below:

- To promote and broad-base sports in the country;
- To identify/ scout sports talent and nurture it;
- To implement schemes/ programmes for achieving excellence in sports in different disciplines at international level in order to establish India as a major sporting power;
- To manage the Stadia in Delhi, which were constructed for the IXth Asian Games held in 1982 and subsequently renovated for Commonwealth Games held in 2010;
- To act as an interface between the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports and respective State Governments, as well as other agencies responsible for promotion/development of sports in the country;
- To establish, run, manage and administer institutions to produce high caliber coaches, sports scientists and physical education teachers;
- To plan, construct, acquire, develop, manage, maintain and utilize sports infrastructure and facilities in the country;
- To initiate, undertake, sponsor, stimulate and encourage research projects related to various sports sciences for upgradation of sports, sportspersons and coaches; and
- To initiate issues and/ or cooperate with other Central or State bodies and other institutions involved in sports promotion and development of sports excellence in the country.



1.4 Organizational Set-Up

The Director General of SAI is the principal executive officer of the organization. He is assisted by a team of senior functional heads of various departments and divisions, which include the Secretary of SAI, Executive Directors, and Heads of Academic Institutions and Regional Centres. The organizational chart for the year 2023-24 is as follows:

SAI has played a significant role in shaping India's sports development by providing training to elite athletes and, at the same time, operating a number of schemes for the identification and development of young talent. The schemes are implemented through various Regional Centres and training centres of SAI spread throughout the country. In addition, a number of academic programmes in physical education and sports are also offered by SAI. Through its sports promotional schemes, SAI supports and nurtures talent among youth and provides them with the requisite infrastructure, equipment, coaching facilities, and competition exposure.



The Operation Division of SAI deals with the implementation of various sports promotional schemes aimed at scouting and nurturing talented sportspersons in different age groups to achieve excellence at the national and international levels.

These schemes are implemented by SAI through its Regional Centres located in Bengaluru, Kolkata, Gandhinagar, Kandivli (Mumbai), Bhopal, Sonepat, Lucknow, Chandigarh (Zirakpur), Guwahati, and Imphal, along with its Academic Wings located at NS NIS, Patiala, and LNCPE, Thiruvananthapuram. The sports science setup is well-developed in Patiala, Bengaluru, and Kolkata, and these facilities are also being upgraded in other Centres.

THE SALIENT FEATURES OF THE SCHEMES ARE AS UNDER:

2.1 SAI National Centre of Excellence (NCOE) Scheme

The Sports Authority of India (SAI) has been implementing various sports promotional schemes at Regional Centres, Academic Institutions, and SAI Training Centres (STC) across the country to identify talented sportspersons and nurture them to excel at national and international competitions.

To maintain uniformity of financial norms and eliminate differentiation between athletes in the same campus/premises at SAI Regional Centres, Academic Institutions, and Stadia, a decision was taken by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, via Office Memorandum No. K-11020/4/2019-Sports-V dated 18.09.2019, to merge all schemes operating in the same campus/premises into the SAI National Centre of Excellence (NCOE).

After the merger of SAI promotional schemes operating in the same campus and stadia, COEs were upgraded to National Centres of Excellence. However, considering the potential and infrastructure, three more NCOEs were added later. As of now, out of 23 approved NCOEs, 22 are operational across India (Zirakpur is not operational) in 13 priority and 11 other sports disciplines.

1. Aims and objectives

In its endeavor to train athletes to achieve excellence in the Olympics and other international events, the Sports Authority of India has established National Centres of Excellence (NCOEs) across the country. These centers impart specialized training to promising athletes by providing state-of-the-art infrastructure and playing facilities, sports science support, individualized diets prescribed by trained nutritionists, and overall supervision by the best coaches, qualified support staff, and High-Performance Directors. National Centres of Excellence operate as regular coaching camps for the best available talent among juniors in India and provide concurrent layers of prospective sports persons, offering a wider choice of talent and continuity for selection to national teams and providing alternative second and third options as well. NCOEs are capable of accommodating elite to development athletes.

- **Disciplines covered by NCOEs:** NCOEs cover 13 focused/ priority disciplines and 11 other disciplines where Indian athletes are performing well and have chances to win medals in the International Events/ Championships/ Games.
- Focused Sports Disciplines: Archery, Athletics, Boxing, Cycling, Fencing, Hockey, Judo, Rowing, Swimming, Shooting, Table Tennis, Weightlifting and Wrestling.
- Other Disciplines: Football, Gymnastics, Badminton, Handball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Kayaking & Canoeing, Para Sports, Taekwondo, Volleyball & Wushu.

4. Sanctioned Strength:

Depending on infrastructure availability, medal prospects, sport's popularity, and several other factors, SAI from time to time prescribes the number of athletes that can be trained in each discipline at each NCOE. The total sanctioned strength is further divided into residential and non-residential athletes, and further into male and female athletes to ensure adequate representation for all genders. The current approved sanctioned strength of athletes in the NCOEs is 3,491 (1,800 Residential, 1,691 Non-Residential). However, the working strength for the current year is 3,159 athletes (1,657 Boys & 1,502 Girls).

5. Admission Criteria:

Talent Identification and Development Committees of all the discipline comprising of eminent athletes, eminent coaches, NSF Representatives etc. of their respective disciplines have been entrusted the responsibilities to select/weed out athletes from NCOEs.

6. Train<mark>ed and Skilled Manpower:</mark>

- i. Coaching Staff: NCOEs are providing the best training environment and coaching to the athletes training at NCOEs. To provide best training to the athletes, apart from qualified SAI Coaches, reputed and experienced coaches are being hired or taken on deputation from other departments.
- ii. Scientific Staff: To evaluate/support the performance of young athletes, the scientific experts in the specialized field of Sports Anthropometry, Exercise physiology, Strength & Conditioning, bio-mechanics, Sport Psychology, Sports Medicine, Physiotherapy etc. are being hired at each NCOEs.
- iii. Administrative Staff: To ensure smooth functioning of NCOEs, adequate administrative staff has been posted in the each NCOE.
- iv. Mess Staff: Specialized mess staffs have been engaged to look after the effective functioning of mess to provide quality food as per requirement of each athlete on day-to-day basis.

7. Sports Science Facilities:

As regard to scientific back up at NCOEs, the specialized equipment required for evaluating/ enhancing performance of young athletes are being made available in the NCOEs. The latest scientific equipment has been/ is being procured in the NCOEs. The total cost for setting up scientific facilities across NCOEs is Rs.80.00 Crores in the following departments are being set up in NCOEs:

- 1. Anthropometry
- 2. Biometry
- 3. Biomechanics
- 4. Nutrition
- 5. Performance analysis
- 6. Physiology
- 7. Physiotherapy
- 8. Psychology
- 9. Strength and Conditioning

At present, there are **23 NCOEs** operational in the country having a total strength of **3159** athletes **(1657 Boys &1502 Girls)**. The details are provided at **Annexure – III.**

2.2 SAI Training Centres (SSTC)

Objective:

To groom the Grassroots level/ discipline appropriate age group athletes, SAI Training Centres (STC) are established in States where the sports infrastructure is provided by the respective State Governments.

DISCIPLINES COVERED:

Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Boxing, Cycling, Fencing, Football, Gymnastics, Handball, Hockey, Judo, Kabaddi, Karate, Kayaking & Canoeing, Kho-Kho, Rowing, Sepak Takraw, Shooting, Softball, Swimming, Table Tennis, Taekwondo, Volleyball, Weightlifting, Wrestling & Wushu (27 Disciplines).

SELECTION CRITERIA

(i) Age: 12 to 18 years.

Individual Events:

Up to eighth (08) place in Sub-Junior (including Cadet) and Junior National Championships organized by a recognized National Sports Federation and up to sixth (06) place in Inter-University Championships conducted by Association of Indian Universities, and School Games Federation of India during the current or the year preceding admission.

OR

Sports persons who obtain first three (03) places in the State Championship Conducted by the recognized State Sports Association.

OR

Sports persons who secure any of the first three (03) positions in the Northeast Games & National Rural and Women Championships.

OR

Sports person who has represented India in any recognized Championship/ Tournament by the recognized international federation concerned.

OR

The first three (03) position-holders of District Championships, Inter-Education District Level small Competition, Championships held by Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya, Navodaya Vidyalaya etc.; may be considered for participation in the selection trials.

ii) Age: 10 to 18 years

Team Events:

The talent who could not reach the minimum level of motor quality as per battery of tests may be provisionally selected for six months and only after passing the motor quality tests and specific skill test subsequently, formal induction may be made, if found fit.

Performance criteria for induction:

Any member of a team which has obtained first four (4) positions in Sub-Junior and Junior National Championships organized by recognized National Sports Federation and first two (02) position holder in Inter-Zonal and Inter-University Championships conducted by Association of Indian Universities and School Games Federation of India.

Member of a team which obtained first (01) or second (02) position in the State Championship organized by a recognized State Sports Association.

OR

OR

Sports person who has represented India as a member of the Sub-Junior and Junior team in any recognized Championship/ Tournament for which team was officially sent by the Govt. of India.

OR

Member of Winner and Runners-up in team games in the Northeast Games.

OR

Sports persons who have participated in the recognized State level competitions organized by State Sports Associations, State Sports Council, and State Sports Departments may be considered for participation in the selection trials.

Pre-condition for Admission:

Admission in the above two categories may be based on performance indicators, anthropometric measurements, physiological and psychological tests, and depending on age, discipline, event, and evaluation of future potential by appearing in the selection tests. There will be no direct admission. Admission will be based only on performance and test results, which are to be documented at the time of induction.

Lateral Entry:

Those who achieved the desired performance in the District, State, National and International level competitions and successfully completed the battery of tests, technical and specific skill tests may be inducted at any time of the year.

Retention Criteria:

Retention of the athlete is based on his/her maintaining the minimum level of performance on the basis of which he/she was admitted and also achieving the target set for the year.

Battery of test result, specific test result and performance appraisal record considered at the time of admission should be properly documented as base performance so as to compare the performance enhancement of the athletes periodically.

Training diary of each individual athlete is maintained, which is taken into consideration at the time of retention and weeding out.

Medical Checkup, and Age Verification is essential especially when admission is done on the basis of performance in the Sub-Junior and Junior level Competitions as an effective preventive measure against age fraud.

Weedin<mark>g out:</mark>

a)Not maintaining the expected level of performances.

- b)Injury in capacitating for more than six months from training and or competition; and
- c) Dope abuse, age fraud, misconduct etc.

Monitoring, Half Yearly Scientific Assessment & Academic backup for athletes admitted:

a)Close monitoring and half yearly scientific assessment of all athletes admitted is done by the Institutional/ Regional Heads by engaging the services of in-house sports science facilities or through renowned Sports Science Institutions.

b)As far as possible, efforts are made admission in nearby schools;

c)Induction of talent may be a continuous process instead of linking with Academic session so as to enable SAI to admit the talent whenever a talent is spotted and found eligible for admission.

Relaxation in the retention of athletes beyond the age of **18 years** of age and up to **21 years** can be considered by the Head of Academic Institutions/ Regions in special cases only where there is strong justification based on performance and future prospects.

At present, there are **69 STC Centers** in the country having a total strength of **3899** athletes **(2391 Boys & 1508 Girls)**. The details are provided at **Annexure – III.**

In addition, salary of coaches, supporting staff and maintenance are provided by SAI.



2.3 Extension Centres of STC Centres

Objective:

The scheme of extension centres of STCs was started in 16 disciplines to cover schools and colleges for wider coverage, with a view to develop sports standard in schools and colleges having requisite basic sports infrastructure and have shown good results in sports. The athletes are selected under Non-Residential basis for regular training.

Disciplines Covered:

Archery<mark>,</mark> Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Boxing, Football, Gymnastics, Handball, Hockey, Judo, Kabaddi, Kayaking & Canoeing, Kho-Kho, Table Tennis, Taekwondo & Wrestling.

Selection of the Institution:

Schools and colleges actively involved in sports and having adequate infrastructure are eligible under this scheme. The institution should have a past history of producing national and international sports persons.

Selection of Athletes:

Up to 20 athletes in a School/ College are adopted under the Scheme. The students of nearby schools/colleges can also be admitted. The selection of athletes is done by a duly constituted Committee consisting of (1) Regional Director (SAI) or his representative (2) The Head of the College/Institute or his representative (3) Experts/ Coaches from the school/ college of the concerned discipline (4) Outstanding sports persons of the area. Age is relaxed in cases of commendable results / exceptional talent.

These Extension Centres are attached to nearest STC and monitored by Heads of SAI Regional Centres under whom the respective School/College falls.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

SCHOOLS

- (a) Individual Events Sports Event: Any of first four positions holders of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVs, JNVs.
- (b) Team Games: Winner or Runners-up of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVs, JNVs and qualify under Battery of Tests as per the norms.

COLLEGES:

- (a) Individual: Up to 4th place/ position holders in the Sub-Junior and Junior State Championships organized by recognized State Sports Associations, Inter-College Championships conducted by the University and State level SGFI Championships organized as per SGFI norms.
- (b) Team Games: Winner or Runners-up of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVS, JNVS and qualify under Battery of Tests as per the norms.

UNIVERSITIES: Individual & Team:

Sports persons who have represented University, State in the Zonal / National Championships organized by Association of Indian Universities and by recognized State Association/ National Sports Federations

The performance of the athletes in the battery of tests and achievements at the time of induction should be clearly documented.

The athletes, who failed in the Battery of tests are provisionally selected and will be evaluated after six months for retention.

Battery of tests result, specific test result and performance appraisal record considered at the time of admission should be properly documented as base performance so as to compare the performance enhancement of the athletes periodically.

Pre-condition for Admission: The admission in the above two categories may be made based on the performance indicators, Anthropometric measurement, Physiological & Psychological tests and depending on age, discipline, event and evaluation of future potential and battery of test results and are to be documented at the time of induction.

Lateral Entry: Those who achieved the desired performance in the District, State, National and International level competitions and successfully completed the battery of tests, technical and specific skill tests may be inducted at any time of the year.

Retention Criteria: Retention of the inmate will be based on his/her maintaining the minimum level of performance on the basis of which the inmate was admitted and also achieving the target set for the year.

Weeding out:

- a) Not maintaining the expected level of performance
- b) Dope abuse, age fraud, misconduct.

Monitoring, Half Yearly Scientific Assessment & Academic back up for athletes admitted:

- a) It is recommended that close monitoring and half early scientific assessment of all athletes admitted may be done by Institutional/Regional Heads by engaging the services of in-house sports science facilities or by engaging the services of renowned Sports Science Institutions.
- b) As far as possible, efforts must be made to set up National Open Schooling System under NIOS, Ministry of HRD and Indira Gandhi Open University to do away with the regular academic pressure on the talent admitted.
- c) Induction of talent may be a continuous process instead of linking with Academic session so as to enable SAI to admit the talent whenever a talent is spotted and found eligible for admission.
- d) Concerted efforts may be under-taken with various Public Sectors/Armed Forces/ Corporate to ensure social/job security of the inducted inmates.

Relaxation:

However relaxation both for lower and upper age limit as well as induction can be granted in exceptional cases based on outstanding performance in Battery of Tests and also taking into account specific nature of sports limited to 25% of the new induction.

At present, there are **26 Extension Centres** in the country with a total strength of **426** athletes **(273 Boys & 153 Girls)**. The details are provided at **Annexure – III**.

2.4 NATIONAL SPORTS TALENT CONTEST SCHEME (NSTC)

Objective:

1. National Sports Talent Contest, (NSTC) Scheme is being implemented to scout sports talent in the age group of 8-14 years from schools and nurture them into future medal hopes by providing scientific training.

2. Under the Scheme, schools having good sports infrastructure and record of creditable sports performances are adopted by SAI. The Scheme enables the budding sportsperson to study and play in the same school. In addition to the main scheme of NSTC (launched 1985) wherein regular schools are adopted, a few distinct sub-schemes were launched to further reach out to sports talent in India, even those participating in indigenous sports and games. These sub-schemes of NSTC include:

- Regular Schools
- Indigenous Games & Martial Arts (IGMA)
- Akharas

3. Disciplines covered under the NSTC:

Regular Schools - Athletics, Basketball, Football, Gymnastics, Hockey, Kho-Kho, Swimming, Table Tennis, Volleyball (09 Disciplines).

IGMA - Gatka, Kabaddi, Kalariapayatu, Mukna, Malkhamb, Thang-Ta, Silambam, Khomlainai (08 Disciplines)

- **Akharas –** Wrestling (01 Discipline)
- 4. NSNIS trained coaches are provided to adopted schools & akhara for regular training.
- 5. Selection Criterion of Regular Schools (NSTC)

The performance of the athletes in the battery of tests and achievements at the time of induction should be clearly documented.

Individual/Team Events:

- A. Athletes, who are medal winners in State/National Level Competitions are admitted into the scheme, subject, to their being found medically fit.
- B. Athletes who are medal winners at District Level Competition or have participation in State Level Competitions are admitted subject to their being found fit medically and physically and also have the required potential which is assessed by battery of tests.
- C. For selection from the remote, tribal & coastal areas, the athletes are also selected by organizing competitions among participants. Selection is done by a selection committee consisting of representatives of SAI, School/ Akharas, SAI coaches, sports scientists etc. The sports persons identified on this basis are admitted after age verification, medical examination and on found suitable by applying battery of tests.

Pre-condition for Admission:

The admission in the above two categories may be made based on the performance indicators, Anthropometric measurement, Physiological & Psychological tests and depending on age, discipline, event and evaluation of future potential and battery of test result and are to be documented at the time of induction.

Retention Criteria:

Retention of the athletes will be based on his/her maintaining the minimum level of performance on the basis of which the inmate was admitted and also achieving the target set for the year.

Weeding out:

- Not maintaining the expected level of performance
- Dope abuse, age fraud, misconduct.

Monitoring, Half Yearly Scientific Assessment & Academic back up for athletes admitted:

It is recommended that close monitoring and half yearly scientific assessment of all athletes admitted may be done by Institutional/Regional Heads by engaging the services of in-house sports science facilities or by engaging the services of renowned Sports Science Institutions.

Relaxation:

However, relaxation both for lower and upper age limit as well as induction can be granted in exceptional cases based on outstanding performance in Battery of Tests and also considering specific nature of sports, for which prior approval of DG, SAI would be needed.

INDGIENOUS GAMES AND MARTIAL ARTS (IGMA) (Sub-Scheme of NSTC)

With a view to promote indigenous games & martial arts in the schools in rural and semiurban areas and scouting of talent in these games for nurturing in modern sports this scheme was launched in November, 2001 schools runs by Educational Institutions having cluster of Schools like Kendriya Vidyalayas, Navodaya Vidyalayas, DAV, Vidya Bharati & similarly placed institutions for promotion & development of indigenous games & martial arts were also included as part of NSTC Scheme.

SELECTION CRITERIA: Age: 8 to 14 years.

The performance of the athletes in the battery of tests and achievements at the time of induction should be clearly documented.

Selection Criteria for Induction:

- a. Talents, who are medal winners in State/National Level Competitions are admitted into the scheme, subject, to their being found medically fit.
- b. Talents who are medal winners at District Level Competition or have participation in State Level Competitions are admitted subject to their being found fit medically and physically.
- c. The scouting of the talent in indigenous games is to be done on the basis of open competitions among participants. Selection is done by a selection committee consisting of representatives of SAI, Institutions, SAI coaches, guru/mentor of the concerned game. The sports persons identified on this basis are admitted after age verification, medical examination etc.
- Retention Criteria: Retention of the inmate will be based on his/her maintaining the minimum level of performance on the basis of which the inmate was admitted and also achieving the target set for the year.

Weeding out:

- Not maintaining the expected level of performance
- Dope abuse, age fraud, misconduct.

Monitoring:

Close monitoring and half yearly evaluation of the adopted Clubs/Institutions is carried out through Institutional Heads/ Regional Centres. Exceptionally talented boys & girls may be admitted in the SAI SAG Centre or SAI Sports Academy as per the discipline and eligibility criteria.

Relaxation:

However relaxation both for lower and upper age limit as well as induction can be granted by concerned Regional Head in exceptional cases based upon outstanding performance in Battery of Tests and also taking into account specific nature of sports, for which prior approval of DG, SAI would be needed.

ADOPTION OF AKHARAS UNDER NSTC SCHEME

INTRODUCTION

Wrestling has been a traditional indigenous sport in the country and mostly played at village level. India has won many international medals in the past and has been a force to reckon with. Therefore, efforts are being made to create a broader base for modern wrestling and supplement the efforts made by various akharas in the country.

ADOPTION OF AKHARAS

Keeping in view the peculiar nature of wrestling sport adoption of akharas having a minimum 20x20m covered hall for placing wrestling mats, 15x15m cover hall for installing a multi-gym and other allied facility, is approved.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

The selection criteria of NSTC regular adopted schools are applied for selecting talented wrestlers.



OBJECTIVES AND FUNCTIONS

- To conduct coaching camps and to assist the national teams for participation in International competitions;
- To implement and monitor the sports promotional schemes of SAI and Govt. of India, in the region;
- To conduct Diploma course in Coaching in collaboration with the Academic Wing of SAI at NSNIS Patiala;
- To raise the technical competence and knowledge of the coaches by conducting refresher course;
- To conduct refresher course for Physical Education teachers;
- To provide organizational support, documentation and sports science information to all concerned with a view to achieve excellence in sports through knowledge enhancement;
- To liaise with other organizations/sports bodies, State Govt./UT Admn. and provide information on sports related subjects;
- To identify sports talent among different age groups and grooming them for achieving excellence in their performance; and
- To provide scientific back-up to sports persons in achieving high level performance in sports.

3.1 SAI Netaji Subhas Eastern Regional Centre (NSEC), Kolkata

The SAI Eastern Centre was established on 23rd January, 1983 at Salt Lake City, Kolkata. The centre is responsible for implementing and monitoring SAI schemes in the States of Bihar, Jharkhand, Odissa, West Bengal, Tripura and Andaman & Nicobar Islands



The Centre is responsible for implementing and monitoring SAI Sports Promotional Schemes in the States of Manipur, Mizoram and Nagaland.

3.10 SAI Regional-Centre, Mumbai

The Sports Training Centre in Mumbai was established in 1989 with the primary objectives of overall promotion and development of sports in Maharashtra. An agreement was executed on 31st August 1989 between Sports Authority of India and Government of Maharashtra for handing over the premises and other facilities to SAI for establishing Sports Hostel. SAI RC Mumbai started working independently from June 2015 with the states of Maharashtra, Goa and UTs of Daman & Diu and Dadra Nagar Haveli. On 29th April 2016 Govt. of Maharashtra has handed over 140 acres of land at Nagpur to open Sports Authority of India, Netaji Subhas Deendayal Upadhyaya Regional Centre.

As per notification dated 13-07-2020, RC, Kandivali, Mumbai has been renamed as **"SAI,** Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee National Centre of Excellence, Mumbai".

CHAPTER-IV TONSOFS

Two academic institutions, one each in the field of sports coaching and physical education, are functioning under SAI, namely the Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports (NSNIS), Patiala and the Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE), Thiruvananthapuram.

4.1 Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports, Patiala

The National Institute of Sports was inaugurated on 7th May 1961 to herald an era of systematic and scientific sports coaching in country. In the year 1973, the Institute was dedicated to the memory of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. After merger of SAI & SNIPES in 1987, the Institute became the Academic Wing of Sports Authority of India. It is considered a Premier Sports Institute in Asia. The Institute is located at Moti Bagh Palace, Patiala (Punjab). The total area of the Institute is 268 Acres.

Aims & Objectives of the Institute

- To conduct short & long term academic courses in sports coaching, sports sciences and other related fields.
- To raise the competence of the coaches through the organization of refresher courses.
- To conduct the National Coaching Camps for elite sportspersons, for international competitions.
- To provide scientific back up to the elite sportspersons, for achievements of high level performance.
- To organize conferences, seminars, workshops, on sports-related subjects
- To serve as a source of information and counseling, on sports infrastructure, through experts.
- To implement the sports promotion schemes of SAI.
- Organization of National level competitions of the sports promotion schemes of MYA&S.
- Identification of sports talent at national level competitions of sports promotion schemes of Govt. of India, for further grooming.

I. Academic Programmes

1. Diplom<mark>a Course in S</mark>ports Coaching

One year diploma course was conducted by the Institute at Patiala and its three academic sub centers of, Bangalore, Kolkata & Thiruvananthapuram during the academic year 2022-23. 331 trainees attended Diploma in Sports Coaching in eleven sports disciplines at Patiala. 255 trainees in eleven sports disciplines at SAI NS South Centre, Bangalore, 144 students in five sports disciplines at SAI NS Eastern centre, Kolkata and 13 students in Rowing, Kayaking & Canoeing at Thiruvananthapuram. In all, 743 trainees qualified to become Coaches, in 26 sports disciplines. Academic wing of SAI, NSNIS, Patiala conducted the following academic training courses under Coaches Education Programme during the year 2023-24. For the admission to Diploma Course session 2023-24, the applications were invited through online mode. Entrance examination was conducted by the National Testing Agency through online mode. Virtual interviews were also conducted through online mode. Classes of diploma courses started from 12th July 2023 and the first Semester Exam was conducted in the month of December 2023. At Patiala, 330 trainees, at Bangalore, 263 trainees at Kolkata 147 trainees and at Thiruvananthapuram 06 trainees were admitted for this Diploma Course in Coaching course during the current session i.e., 2023-24. So far, 23,867 persons have qualified under this programme since 1961. National Sports Federations Level courses The Federation Level courses were conducted specially for trainees of Diploma in Sports coaching along with their ongoing course. The level courses were conducted in Athletics, Football, and Gymnastics, discipline.

2. M.Sc. Sports Coaching

This Two year degree Course affiliated with the Punjabi University, Patiala is conducted by the Institute at its Patiala Centre only. 17 candidates are undergoing M.Sc. in Sports Coaching in the academic session 2022-2024 in three sport disciplines (11 in Athletics, 05 in Football and 01 in Gymnastics). 22 candidates are undergoing academic session 2023-25. 258 candidates have passed in M.Sc. Sports Coaching up to 2022. The master's Course in Sports Coaching was started in the year 1979 in nine sports disciplines.

3. Certificate Course in Sports Coaching

3681 candidates have completed Six Week certificate Course in Sports Coaching in May-June 2023 Session at SAI NS, NIS, Patiala, SAI NSSC, Bangalore, SAI NSEC, Kolkata and SAI LNCPE, Thiruvananthapuram and 3719 candidates are undergoing in the Six-Week Certificate Course in Sports Coaching during the Dec- January 2024 session at SAI NS, NIS, Patiala, SAI NSSC, Bangalore, SAI NSEC, Kolkata and SAI LNCPE, Thiruvananthapuram in 28 sports discipline.

4. Skill Development Programme:

A. Sports Massage course

The Three-week Skill Development Programme in Sports Massage (Basic and advanced) was conducted twice in 2023 in collaboration with London School of Massage. The numbers are as below:

- a. Basic Sports Massage Course 116
- b. Advance Sports Massage Course 61

5. E-Khel Pathshala

Khelo India E-Khel Pathshala concept is aimed at developing the competencies of Grassroots/Community Coaches and PE teachers through provisioning of physical & online training, enabling them to subsequently provide standardized coaching. The shooting of 3 Sports Disciplines namely Archery, Boxing and Table Tennis for development of content for e-Khel Pathshala was successfully conducted and completed at SAI, NSNIS, Patiala. Sports science shooting for archery, table tennis, and boxing has been completed. Further, 10 new sports disciplines have been identified for pre-basic and basic sports shooting.

6. NS NIS Patiala conducted a Four-Week Sports Administration and Management Course for Physical Education Teachers of the Union Territory of Ladakh (Between the months of September to November 2023) for Total: 212 trainees.

7. Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Medicine:

Post Graduate Diploma in Sports Medicine (PGDSM) is being conducted by the Institute for Medical Graduates (MBBS). This course is affiliated with Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot, Punjab,

and is recognised by t<mark>he National</mark> Medical Commission. The total intake is 6 seats per year and the duration of course is 2 years.

8. Six month Certificate Courses in Sports Sciences

Second batch of 6 month Certificate Courses under MoU between SAI NSNIS, Patiala and Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research (Deemed University), Chennai were conducted in the disciplines of Strength and Conditioning (56), Sports Psychology (4), Sports Nutrition (44) and Sports Physiotherapy (4). A total of 108 students fulfilling eligibility criteria in the concerned subjects enrolled for the courses.

9. Khelo India - Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) Capacity Building Program in Sports Coaching 2023-24 Khelo India Past Champion Athlete (PCA) Capacity Development Program is a special course designed for the athletes hired in Khelo India Centres (KICs). Khelo India - Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) Capacity Building Program in Sports Coaching 2023-24 Program has been started from 04.12.2023 for 409 trainees (for a duration of Six weeks).

10. P.G. Diploma in Sports Performance Analysis

The course aims at producing competent and industry ready performance analysts, to contribute to SAI's vision of achieving sports excellence. The first batch of course started with 30 seats and the 2nd batch of course started from the month of July 2023 with 49 trainees. Three international Guest Faculties are engaged for the delivery of lectures in the course.

11. First P.G. Diploma in Strength & Conditioning First batch of Strength and Conditioning Course was launched in July 2023. Total 50 students enrolled for

the course (35 Male, 15 F). Three international Guest Faculties are engaged for the delivery of lectures in the course.

A. Australian Strength and Conditioning Association (ASCA) Level Course:

NSNIS, Patiala, has established a partnership with the Australian Strength and Conditioning Association (ASCA). PGDSC students got the optional opportunity to delve into this course, broadening their learning horizons in the field.106 students have completed level -1(in 3 batches) in the Month of Oct. 2023 and 91 students have completed level -1(in 3 batches) in the Month of Feb.- March. 2024

12. First P.G. Diploma in Sports Nutrition:

The Post graduate diploma in Sports Nutrition was started in the month of July 2023. The primary aim of the course is to equip the students to use nutrition related knowledge and skills to address optimal performance and wellbeing of athletes. 20 students from various parts of India have enrolled in the course. Three international Guest Faculties are engaged for the delivery of lectures in the course.

13. First P.G. Diploma in Sports Psychology:

P.G. Diploma in Sports Psychology is a one year post graduate diploma course launched in Aug 2023, which trains and equips the students to use psychological knowledge and skills to address optimal performance and well-being of athletes. Total 25 students (09 male & 15 Female) have enrolled for the course. Two international Guest Faculties are engaged for the delivery of lectures in the course.

14. First P.G. Diploma in Exercise Physiology:

The First batch of P.G. Diploma Course in Exercise Physiology was launched in July 2023. This course was designed with the aim to upgrade the knowledge in Exercise Prescription programs for Sports Persons /General clients and how Physiology can be a part of the process of High-performance in the Sports Ecosystem. Total 06 students (05 male & 1 Female) have enrolled for the course. One international Guest Faculty is engaged for the delivery of lectures in the course.

15. National Symposium on Performance Analysis:

National Level Symposium on Performance Analysis organized by the Sports Authority of India's Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports (SAI NSNIS) Patiala on Aug 08, 2023. The theme of the symposium revolved around discussing the extent of sports performance analysis in a global context and exploring its role in high performance. This symposium delivered enriching experience for all, fostering greater understanding and knowledge exchange in the realm of Sports Performance Analysis internationally acclaimed experts.

16. International Symposium on, "Synergizing Performance:

Integrating Rehabilitation and Strength & Conditioning in High-Performance Athletes" International Level Symposium on "Synergizing Performance: Integrating Rehabilitation and Strength & Conditioning in High-Performance Athletes" organized by the Sports Authority of India's Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports (SAI NSNIS) Patiala on February 23rd, 2024. The theme of the symposium revolved around a comprehensive understanding of the principles and importance of integrated rehabilitation and strength & conditioning in athletic high performance. Symposium emphasized the importance of an integrative approach, encouraging collaboration between rehabilitation specialists, strength & conditioning coaches for comprehensive athlete care. And also addressed the unique challenges faced by athletes, coaches, and sports organizations in integrating rehab and S&C practices, offering solutions and strategies to overcome barriers.

17. Sports Sciences Internship Program:

The program of Internship in Sports Science at SAI, Academic centers is to provide an opportunity and exposure to the Graduates/Post Graduates/Research Scholars enrolled in recognized universities/institutions in India and abroad in Sports Sciences/Sports Nutrition/ Exercise Biochemistry/Sports Physiotherapy/Sports Physiology/Sports Medicine/Sports Biomechanics/Sports Anthropometry Psychology/ to the Research and Development activities carried out by Sports Authority of India in state of art laboratories in the fields relevant to the sports sector.

TEAMS (Training of Elite Athletes & Management Support) Division is entrusted with the responsibility of preparing National teams in different sports disciplines for various National & International Sports events in coordination with the National Sports Federations concerned, on behalf of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. In other words, it provides necessary facilities to elite sport person preparing for International Sports events like Olympics, Paralympics, Asian Games, Asian Para Games, Commonwealth games and World Cup and other International Competitions in India and Abroad. It implements plans prepared by various National Sports Federations vide their Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) and approved by the Committee for preparation of National Teams for National and International Tournaments by providing the various facilities.

TOPS (Target Olympic Podium Scheme) is a flagship program of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports which is an attempt to provide assistance to India's top athletes. The Scheme looks to add a premium to the preparations of these athletes so that they can win medals in the Olympics.

It implements plans prepared by various National Sports Federations vide their Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) and approved by the Committee for preparation of National Teams for National and International Tournaments by providing the following facilities:

5.1 Coaching Camps

The details of National Coaching Camps held under the Scheme during 2023-24 is provided at **Annexure – V.**

5.2 International Competitions/Training

The Indian teams took part in various international training/competitions in all major sports disciplines during 2023-24. The Achievements of Indian Athletes are provided at **Annexure** – VI.

5.3 Sports Science Back – Up

Sports science services in the form of doctors in Sports Medicine, Scientists, Physiotherapists and Masseurs etc. are being provided to the Sportspersons during National Coaching Camps for enhancing their fitness, recovery from injury/ medical deficiency.





Stadia Management of SAI:

The Government of India, Dept. of Sports in pursuance of the Resolution No. 1-1/83/SAI dated 25.01.1984 established the Sports Authority of India (SAI) as a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, as a successor Organization of the IX Asian Games held in New Delhi in 1982 with the twin objectives of broad basing of sports and to achieve excellence at National and International level.Over the years SAI has emerged as a field arm of Sports of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS) of Union of India. The stated objective of SAI is "to promote and develop sports activities relating and incidental thereto and to draw up and implement plans for the promotion of sports and improvement of standards in the country in sports and games in keeping with the sports policy of India."

Sports Authority of India has five stadia in Delhi namely JNS, IGSC, Dr. SPMSPC, MDCNS and Dr. KSSR. These were built as venue for IX Asian Games 1982 and subsequently renovated/upgraded with state of Art facilities developed for Commonwealth Games 2010.The details are as under: -

1. Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium Complex (JNS) – 100 Acres (404686 sq.mtr.) land area

- Out -door stadium (Synthetic Athletic Track & Football Ground) with 60,000 fixed seats, covered by PTFF membrane roof.
- Warm-up Area (Synthetic Athletic Track & Football Ground)
- Fully Air-conditioned Weightlifting Auditorium (26000 sq.mtr.) with 2172 fixed seats
- Available sports facilities Athletics, Archery, Badminton, Basketball, Cricket, Football Color-field, Tennis, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Weightlifting, , Fitness Centre, Billiard & Snooker.
- 140 bedded Sports Hostel.
- 110 bedded (55 Rooms) Sports Hostel.

2. Indira Gandhi Stadium Complex(IGSC), - 104 Acres (420873.44 sq.mtr) land area

- Gymnastic Hall wooden floor (fully AC) with 15000 fixed seats.
- Wrestling Hall (fully AC) with 5000 fixed seats .
- Cycling Velodrome (fully AC) with 3000 fixed seats.
- Available sports facilities Badminton, Basketball, Boxing, Cricket, Cycling, Gymnastic, Judo, Table Tennis, speak takraw, Wushu, & Wrestling, Fitness Centre.
- 150 bedded Sports Hostel.
- Recreational and Health Lifestyle facilities: Sauna Bath and Massage Centre which is being used by National Campers and Elite Sports Person.
- Medical Centre with consisting of following three major units:
 - Sports Medicine unit
 - Sports Rehabilitation & Post Exercise Recovery Services
 - Sports Physiotherapy & Nutritionist

3. Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Swimming Pool Complex (Dr. SPMSPC), -12.13 acres (49088.36 sq.mtr.) land area, fully AC Indoor Stadium with 5000 fixed seats

- 50 Mtr. Swimming pool (10 lane)
- 25 Mtr. Diving pool
- 50 Mtr. Warm-up pool (six lane)
- Available sports facilities In addition to Swimming there is facility for Volleyball, Skating, Billiard & Snooker and Multi-Gym.

4. Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium(MDCNS), - 37 acres (146746 sq.mtr) land area Outdoor Stadium, VIP seating covered with standing seam roof, 14,000 fixed seats in new open gallery and 6000 seats in covered area, Three International standard competition Hockey Astroturf.

• Available sports facilities –Hockey, Kabaddi, Tennis, Swimming, Cricket, Multi Gym & Squash court.

5. Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Ranges (Dr. KSSR), Tuglakabad, New Delhi – 72.41 Acres (293032.87 sq.mtr.)land area

- The final Range capable of converting from a fully air conditioned 10 Mtr. Range to nonair conditioned 25 Mtr. and 50 Mtr. Ranges within 10 minutes.
- Fully covered Air conditioned 10 Mtr. with 80 firing points, 25 Mtr. range with 50 firing points and 50 M range with 80 firing points.
- 6 ranges for Trapped Skeet events.
- Available sports facilities Volleyball, Billiard hall, Fitness Centre and Steam & Sauna.
- 162 bedded Sports Hostel.
 - However, to optimize utilization of sporting facilities and to put optimum utilization of sporting facilities and to promote sporting culture, the scheme of 'Come & Play' was launched in May'2011. Further the sports infrastructure at SAI Stadia in Delhi has been made accessible without fee, to all sports persons across the country from 1st November 2019. National and State Sports Federations, league and Club will be allowed/encouraged to organize sports events in all sporting facilities owned by the Government, free of cost. The sporting facilities will also be accessible free of cost to coaches training athletes who are not part of camps organized in Sports Authority of India Centres. Admission can be done through offline or the web portal sportsauthorityofindia.nic.in /online sports facility.

- These stadia are also being provided to Educational Institutions/Federations/Associations to conduct their sports tournament(s) at different levels at free of cost, Meetings & Seminars, Food Festival under Sports and for Non-Sports events (on payment basis) and space (exclusively not meant for sports purposes) are rented out to Govt. Offices to generate the revenue which can be used for the maintenance of these stadia.
- Utilization of unutilized / underutilized infrastructure of SAI Stadia The proposal for Utilization of Un-utilized/under-utilized infrastructure of SAI Centers on Highest Fixed Revenue basis (H1) for a period of contract of 3 years extendable by 2 years for JNS and 5 years extendable by 2 years for other stadia was approved in the 56th Meeting of the Governing Body of SAI. Utilization of Stadia

The Delhi Stadia are utilized for the following purposes-

1. Holding of National Coaching Camps for preparation of Indian players for the International competitions. National camps are being held for shooting at Dr. KSSR, for Boxing, Gymnastics and Cycling at IGS, Hockey at MDCNS and Athletics, Table Tennis and Archery at JNS and Swimming at Dr. SPMSPC.

2. In order to put the sporting facilities in the stadia to optimum utilization and to promote sporting culture, the scheme of Come & Play was launched in May 2011. The scheme aims to cover common people of all groups.

3. Further the sports infrastructure at SAI Stadia in Delhi have been made accessible without fee, to all sports persons across the country from 1st November 2019. National and State Sports Federations, league and Club have been allowed/encouraged to organize sports events in all sporting facilities owned by the Government, free of cost. The sporting facilities are also accessible free of cost to coaches training athletes who are not part of camps organized in Sports Authority of India Centres.

4. Few facilities are also made available for non-sports purposes on approved tariff for the purpose of revenue generation without disturbing sports activities.

5. The identified areas have also been rented out to other Organizations on approved license fee for the purpose of revenue generation.

6. The existing state-of-art facilities have been utilized for setting up of following National Centre of Excellence for:

- National Centre of Excellence for Swimming at Dr. SPMSPC.
- National Centre of Excellence for Cycling at IGS.
- National Centre of Excellence for Gymnastics at IGS.
- National Centre of Excellence for Hockey at MDCNS.
- National Centre of Excellence for Shooting at Dr. KSSR

CHAPTER-IX

INFRASTRUCTURE

The Infrastructure Division is the nodal Division for creating requisite infrastructure in coordination with the Regional Centres/Sub-Centres & their units and Academic Institutions of SAI.

The roles and responsibilities of Infra Division are given as under.

1. Sports Facility Planning and Development:

- Develop comprehensive plans for sports facilities, including stadiums, training Centres, and sports complexes.
- Collaborate with relevant stakeholders, including but not limited to RCs, executing agencies, respective sports federations, etc. to ensure facilities meet international standards and cater to various sports disciplines.

2. Infrastructure Maintenance:

- Implement a preventive maintenance program for sports infrastructure to ensure longevity and optimal performance.
- Respond promptly to repair needs and infrastructure issues to minimize downtime.
- Prediction of the needs of maintenance in future according to the data collated with the RCs.

3. Accessibility and Inclusivity:

• In accordance with the Government guidelines of Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan, creation of infrastructure that is disabled friendly is one of the priorities of the Division.

4. Collaboration with Sports Federations:

• Ensure compliance with standards set by relevant sport's governing bodies.

5. Grassroots Sports Development:

- Develop and implement programs to promote grassroots sports development, including the construction of community sports facilities.
- Facilitate the growth of sports at the grassroots level to identify and nurture talent. This would include Infra proposals in areas like STC Dimapur, NCoE Cooch Behar, STC Kargil, etc.

6. Budget Management:

- Develop and manage budgets for sports infrastructure projects.
- This also includes collaboration with MYAS for the budget projection with respect to the demand of the projects in hand and future needs of the RCs.

7. Government Policy Adherence:

• Ensure adherence to government policies, guidelines, and regulations related to sports infrastructure, e.g., GFR 2022, Accessible India campaign, Khelo India guidelines, etc.

8. Public-Private Partnerships:

- Explore and facilitate partnerships with private entities for the development and maintenance of sports infrastructure.
- Leverage public-private collaborations to enhance the quality and accessibility of sports facilities. CSR benefits of companies are put forth in infrastructure development for the athletes as in SAPC Gandhinagar, 330 bedded hostel Bangalore, etc.

To achieve the twin objectives of mass participation and promotion of excellence in sports, the Cabinet at its meeting held on 20/09/2017 approved the revamp of "Khelo India – National Programme for Development of Sports."

1. The revamped Khelo India programme aims at strengthening the entire sports ecosystem to promote the above mentioned twin national objectives of sports development, which includes playfield development; community coaching development; promotion of community sports; establishment of a strong sports competition structure at both school and university level as also for rural / indigenous sports, sports for persons with disability and women sports; filling up of critical gaps in sports infrastructure, including creation of hubs of sports excellence in select universities; talent identification and development; support to sports academies; implementation of a national physical fitness drive for school children; and sports for peace and development.

2. The scheme provides for a Project Appraisal Committee (PAC), which appraises all proposals received under the scheme and place them before a Departmental Project Approval Committee (DPAC) for approval. The approved projects are subject to strict monitoring, including third party monitoring, for which State level monitors are engaged.

3. The scheme has adequate flexibility, including need-based re-appropriation of allocations across components.

4. The scheme provides for complete transparency and also provides for convergence with Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activities and Public Private Partnership (PPP) activities.

5. The selection of projects under the scheme is based on robust selection criteria, including challenge method.

KHELO INDIA- NATIONAL PROGRAMME FOR DEVELOPMENT OF SPORTS

Vision: To infuse sports culture and achieve sporting excellence in the country.


Mission

To encourage sports all over the country thus allowing the population to harness the power of sports through its cross-cutting influence, namely, holistic development of children & youth, community development, social integration, gender equality, healthy lifestyle, national pride and economic opportunities related to sports development.

1.1 Components of the Scheme:

The Khelo India Scheme would include the following components/objectives:

- Creation and Upgradation of Sports Infrastructure
- Sports Competitions and Talent Development
- Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies
- Fit India Movement
- Promotion of Inclusiveness through Sports



STATE LEVEL KHELO INDIA CENTRES:

As a part of India's pursuit for excellence in Olympics and endeavor to scale-up State/UT's existing centre up to world standard level, one of the existing training centres will be designated as Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) under the State Level Khelo India Centre (SLKIC) vertical of the Khelo India scheme.

As of now, 32 Centres in 31 States/UTs managed by State/UT administration have been notified as KISCE where-in financial support in terms of manpower, sports equipment, sports science support, etc. are provided after conducting viability gap analysis.

As a part of Government's vision to strengthen the sports ecosystem in the country at the grassroots level, a low-cost, effective sports training mechanism has been worked out wherein past "Champion Athletes" would become coaches and mentors for youngsters, running sports training in an autonomous manner, and earning their livelihood. At present, 1040 training centers in 36 States/UTs including 35 Railway KICs have already been notified as Khelo India Centres (KIC).

With a view to utilize the disciplined atmosphere of Army and infrastructure available, Army Boys Sports Company Scheme was introduced in association with Army in which young talent is identified in the age group of 8-14 years and admitted in the Scheme. At present there are 20 ABSCs, 01 Navy Boys Sports Company and 01 Air force Boys Sports Company Squadron in the country.

TALENT SEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT:

Khelo India Talent Identification& Development (KITD) is one of the most important verticals of the Khelo India Scheme. The country with vast diversity in terms of physical attributes offers immense opportunity to excel in the field of sports provided sporting talent is identified at right time and age-appropriate nurturing is done by coaches with the help of sports science support to achieve the objective winning medals in Olympics.

Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for training purpose. The KIAs who train in the Khelo India accredited academies are entitled for the financial support in tune of Rs. 6.28 Lakhs per annum and in addition to that Rs. 10,000/- per month as Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA). The KIAs, who have not joined any academy, are provided only OPA. Total 2717 KIAs are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around 299 academies have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

PHYSICAL FITNESS FOR SCHOOL GOING CHILDREN:

It aims to evolve region-wise National Fitness Parameters and to provide a toolkit to each school to evaluate physical fitness to all school-going children. Khelo India Mobile Application was launched to enable the general public to get information and ease of access to the various aspects of the game (HOW TO PLAY), available playfields across India (WHERE TO PLAY) or mapping the fitness parameters of the young school-going population of the country. Following developments have taken place under this vertical (As 09.01.2024): For physical fitness assessment, in the Khelo India Mobile Application, 2,31,938 Schools and 3,62,581 assessors are registered.8404289 student profiles have been created and out of these 25,93,420 numbers of fitness, assessments have been made. A total no. of 317 online/offline Training of Trainer programs (TOTs) had been conducted under this vertical in which more than 3,62,581 Physical Education Teachers were given training. completion of the examination, an online certificate will be issued to the participant.

STATUS ON PROMOTION OF RURAL AND INDIGENOUS GAMES:

Till date, Mallakhamb, Kalaripayattu, Gatka and Thang-Ta have been identified for support under the vertical of "Promotion of Rural and Indigenous/Tribal Games" under the scheme of Khelo India in the DPAC held under the Chairmanship of Secretary Sports, MYAS on 04.06.2019. Grants were sanctioned for infrastructure development, equipment support, appointment of coaches, training of coaches and scholarships.

As per approval of DPAC One-time grant was provided to the NSF for infrastructure development, equipment support and salary of coaches.

283 athletes were provided Scholarships @ Rs 10,000 per month from 1st Oct 2019 till June 2021 under the scheme.

Scholarships have been approved for a maximum of 350 athletes after selection through a Talent Identification Committee for the disciplines of Mallakhamb, Kalaripayattu, Gatka, Thang-Ta and Yogasana.

STATUS ON PROMOTION OF SPORTS AMONG PERSONS WITH DISABILITY:

A sum of Rs. 5.7 Crore was agreed to support District and State Games. The future modalities are being worked in consultation with the concerned Federations i.e. Special Olympics Bharat, All India Sports Council of Deaf and Paralympic Committee of India.

- SLKIC: 32 Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) in 31 states have been notified.
- 3865 trainees have been covered in 67 SAI-STCs under the SLKIC vertical.
- 299 academies accredited for training of Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) in 21 Sports discipline.
- The **3rd edition of Khelo India University Games 2022** was successfully conducted in Uttar Pradesh from **25th May to 3rd June 2023** across 21 sports with the participation of 3613 Athletes, 754 Support Staff, 884 Technical Officials and 1234 Volunteers.
- The 1st edition of Khelo India Para Games 2023 was organized from 10th 17th December 2023 in Delhi. The games were organized across 3 venues in the city of Delhi across 7 sports Disciplines (Para Archery, Par Athletics, Para Badminton, Para Table Tennis, Para Powerlifting, CP Football, Para Shooting) with the participation of 1370 athletes, 229 Technical Officials, 458 Volunteers, 14 Classifiers, 291 Support Staffs, 336 Escorts.
- The **6th edition of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG)** was held from **19th to 31st January 2024,** in four cities of Tamil Nadu namely, Chennai, Trichy, Madurai, and Coimbatore. KIYG shall feature competitions across 26 sports and 1 demo sport. The sport of Squash was organized for the first time in this edition of the Games. The Games had the participation of 4454 athletes, 1020 Technical Officials, 455 Volunteers, 1240 Support Staff, 39 Chef De Mission, & 26 Competition Managers
- The **4th edition of Khelo India Winter Games 2024** was organized from **2nd to 6th February** in Leh, Ladakh for Ice Sports and 21st to 25th Feb in Gulmarg, J&K for Snow Sports. The games were organized across 5 venues in Leh and Gulmarg across 6 sports Disciplines (Ice Hockey, Ice Skating, Alpine Skiing, Snowboard, Ski Mountaineering & Nordic Skiing) with the participation of 650 athletes, 109 Technical Officials, 250 Volunteers, & 96 Support Staffs.
- The 4th edition of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) was held from 19th 29th February 2024 in 20 sports across 18 venues in the states of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Sikkim, Nagaland, and Tripura. The Games witnessed participation of 3658 athletes, 883 Technical Officials, 922 Support Staff, 391 Volunteers & 22 Competition Managers
- New list of Talent Identification Development Committee (TIDC), Talent Identification Zonal Committee (TIZC) and State Coordinators and their entitlements have been constituted.
- Recruitment of past champion athletes as a Coach Initiatives have been undertaken to setup 1000 Khelo India Centres (KICs) across the country where in provision has been made for recruiting past champion athletes as a Coach. 1040 KICs have already been approved including 35 Railways and notified in which 920 Past Champion athletes have been recruited as Coaches.

CHAPTER - XII

Fit India Quiz, India's biggest quiz on sports and fitness for school-going children with prize money of Rs. 3.25 crores were launched on 1st September 2022. Fit India Quiz, while providing a national platform for students to showcase their knowledge about fitness and sports, also endeavours to create awareness among students about India's rich sporting history.

- In the second edition of Fit India Quiz 2022, 61,981 students from 16,702 schools had participated in the preliminary round. Amalorpavam H. Sec. School, Puducherry was crowned as the 'National Champion' in the National Round of the second edition of Fit India Quiz 2022. The National Final was streamed on Disney Hotstar and the Star Network. The National Champions are awarded a cash prize of Rs. 25 Lakhs with the winning students getting a cash prize of Rs. 2.5 lakhs.
- The 3rd edition of the Fit India Quiz 2023 was launched on 29th, August 2023, with registration commencing on 4th, September 2023. A total of 41,789 schools and 1,03,671 students have been nominated for the Fit India Quiz 2023. The Preliminary round was conducted by the National Testing Agency on 21st and 22nd, December 2023. The Results were declared on 8th, March 2024, with 256 Schools and 489 students qualifying for the State/UTs round were conducted from 26th March 2024 to 10th, April 2024. The state rounds will be streamed on the official YouTube channel of Fit India.

5. Fit India Mobile App:

The Fit India Mobile App stands out as a unique application that allows citizens to assess their fitness levels through straightforward tests and receive regular tips for enhancing their well-being. Since its launch in 2021, the users are reaping the benefits of its distinctive features, including **age-appropriate fitness protocols**, **step tracking**, **sleep monitoring**, **personalized diet plans**, and more.

Currently, the app has achieved more than **7.83 lakhs** downloads across Android and iOS platform. Its user-friendly interface is enhanced by efficient features such as a single sign-on option through Google, push notifications, and location tracking via pin code and an upgraded UI.

FIMA has also integrated features focused on **tracking cycling and running activities**, demonstrating its commitment to staying ahead in the fitness technology landscape. Further the **FIMA** has been translated into 12 languages including Hindi and English and is available for nationwide download.

6. Fit India Influencers:

With the aim of making fitness a priority for all citizens, Fit India Mission had decided to join hands with well-known names from all walks of life and encourage people to bring about a behavioral change in their lives. With this, the Mission aims to connect with well-known faces from different parts of the country, who will not only make fitness as a priority in their lives but also motivate others to do so. To honor their dedication and commitment towards our mission, we recognize them as Fit India Ambassadors, Fit India Champions and Fit India Icons.

Till date the Fit India Mission has engaged with 22 Fit India Icons, 75 Fit India Champions and 248 Fit India ambassadors.

7. Fit India Week 2023:

The Fit India School Week initiative was conceptualized in 2019 with an objective of fostering awareness about fitness among children, parents, teachers, and school staff. 

The GB approved the proposal for rent-free office space for the NADA in JLN Stadium and for the waiver off the outstanding licence fee payable by the NADA to SAI.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
