MINUTES OF THE 51st MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY (GB) OF SPORTS AUTHORITY OF INDIA (SAI) HELD ON 30.10.2018 AT 10:00 AM AT HOTEL ASHOK, NEW DELHI.

The 51st Meeting of the Governing Body (GB) of Sports Authority of India (SAI) was held on 30.10.2018 at 10:00 am under the Chairmanship of Col. (Retd.) Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore Hon'ble Minister of State (I/C) for Youth Affairs & Sports.

2. The list of participants is placed at Annexure – I.

3. At the very outset, the Member Secretary, Governing Body welcomed the Chairman, the Members and all the participants. The Hon'ble Minister also extended warm welcome and thanked the Members of the Governing Body for their participation. Thereafter, with the permission of the Chair, the Agenda Items were taken up for discussion.

Agenda Item No. 1:

Confirmation of Minutes of the 50th GB meeting held on 4th July, 2018

The Minutes of the 50th meeting of the Governing Body of SAI held on 4th July, 2018 were confirmed

Agenda Item No. 2 :

Action Taken Report on the decisions taken in the 50th GB meeting held on 4th July, 2018

The GB noted the actions taken on the major decisions taken in 50th GB meeting held on 4th July, 2018. However, while discussing the Action Taken Report following suggestions were made:

- Regarding Change of name of Sports Authority of India, it was advised by Mr. Salwan, Member GB that there is need to apply to Registrar of Trademarks as well for the same, which also has a check list required for the purpose. It was also advised by the Chairman that we would need to decide whether the name should be 'Sports India' or 'Sport India'.
- On Restructuring Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS), it was expressed by the representative of Ministry of Finance that SAI must ensure any contractual recruitment should be in accordance with the rules of Govt. for such hiring. DG, SAI suggested for SAI to attract best talent in sports administration, there was a need to pay as per market rate. DG SAI informed that SAI had been engaging foreign coaches on higher salary without any sanctioned posts upto US\$15000. Secretary (Sports) stated that it has been permitted since it is the part of duly approved scheme of National Sports Federation (NSF) by Government of India. DG, SAI further informed that SAI currently has more than 100 vacancies under group-A category. The Chairman suggested that a

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proposal in this regard could be prepared with full justification for permitting SAI to engage the best sports administrators on market rates for consideration of the Cabinet. The GB resolved that this may be done at the earliest.

- Regarding Up-gradation of Shooting Range Equipment, the GB was informed that the proposal is pending as funds need to be provided by the MYAS. The Chairman stated that at least one arena of Olympic standards must be developed for instilling confidence in our athletes and also for enabling invitation from other countries practice in Delhi in the winter months when adverse conditions prevail in many parts of the world. The Chairman suggested that existing equipments when replaced should be shifted to some other Shooting Ranges in the country to ensure optimal utilisation of the same.

Agenda Item No. 3

Approval of Annual Accounts of SAI for the year 2017-18

The proposal was approved. AS & FA suggested that interest accrued, if any on unspent balance under a scheme should be shown as funds under the same scheme.

Agenda Item No. 4

Approval of Annual Report for the year 2017-18

The proposal is approved.

Agenda Item No. 5

Redevelopment of Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium on PPP Model

DG, SAI apprised the GB about the progress in Redevelopment of J.N. Stadium on PPP Model in consultation with NITI Aayog. The proposal is approved in principle. It was informed by the Chairman, GB that the proposal will be sent to the Cabinet for consideration before any further action is initiated.

Agenda Item No. 6

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Partnership

The proposal is approved. It was decided that SAI will follow a transparent procedure while inviting proposals. A detailed Expression of Interest (Eoi) will be floated on SAI website after pre-bid meeting conducted with prospective partners. The Eoi will have all the details such as scope of work, procedure, eligibility criteria, evaluation matrix etc. for selection of appropriate CSR partner to support one or more areas of sports activities/ development. The evaluation will be done by the committee headed by DG, SAI, constituted with the approval of Chairman, Governing Body of SAI.

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Agenda Item no. 7

Increase in delegated financial powers of DG, SAI

It was informed in the meeting that delegation of powers to DG, SAI was made in 2008-09 and hence it is felt necessary to enhance the financial power of DG keeping in view the time gap and for smooth functioning of the Organisation. Dr. M.P. Ganesh also supported by saying that *"for the last two years I could not buy a proprietary item through SAI of 82.00 lakhs and lots of criticism from all angles due to lack of insufficient delegated powers"*. He further suggested that *"whosoever is the authority, the powers be enhanced so that proprietary items could be got in time, otherwise there is no point in running such scheme"*.

The proposal is approved. Secretary (Sports) and AS&FA, MYAS suggested that SAI should ensure the proposal is in conformity with the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India for such delegation.

Agenda Item No. 8

Waiver and refund of Booking Charges of SAI Stadia

- a) Women's World Boxing Champion – waiver of booking charges. The proposal is approved.
- b) CISF Annual Programme – Refund of Booking Charges. The proposal is approved.

GB also resolved that powers of waiver of booking charges of SAI Stadia for similar events should be vested with the Chairman, GB.

Agenda Item No. 9

Adoption of School under Akhara Scheme of NSTC

The proposal is approved.

Agenda Item No. 10

Development of Khelo India Fitness Mobile Application

The proposal is ratified. However, it was suggested that data so collected should be shared with the State Governments as Sports is a State subject to create fitness and creativity of sports amongst the children and youth.

Agenda Item No. 11

Amendment in the Recruitment Rule for the post of Assistant Director

The proposal is approved. The Chairman, GB was of the opinion that 70% weightage for marks scored by the candidates in UPSC Exam needs to be relooked. He suggested that all such shortlisted candidates should be treated at par and subjected to the Aptitude/Skill/Psychometric tests/Personality assessment by SAI for selection. The percentage of Interview could be limited to 20%.

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Agenda Item no. 12
Recruitment in Khelo India/ TOPS Secretariat

As noted in Action Taken Report of restructuring Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS)

Supplementary Agenda
Issue relating to Coach Development

The proposal is approved.

Other Points discussed during the meeting with the permission of Chair

- **Medical/CGHS to SAI employees** : Dr. M.P. Ganesh, Member GB suggested that the medical facilities should also be provided to the retired pensioners of Sports Authority of India. DG, SAI informed that SAI is exploring various options in this regard.
- **Appointment of Coaches in Administrative Cadre** : Dr. M.P. Ganesh also raised the issue that Coaches are not being recruited in Administrative Cadre though there exists the provisions in Recruitment Rules of 10% reservation to the post of Deputy Director. DG, SAI informed that SAI is seized of the matter and action is being taken.

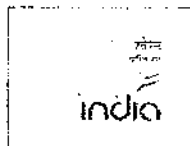

SAI is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, with the mandate of development and promotion of Sports in the country. SAI's main objective today is to achieve excellence in sports, train & prepare sportspersons to participate in International Competitions. It has centres across the country to provide training & Infrastructure for excellence in Sports.

3.0 DETAILS OF THE POST

Minutes of the 75th Meeting of the Executive Committee of National Sports Development Fund (NSDF) held on 1st March 2019 in the Chamber of Secretary (Sports) in Shastri Bhavan, New Delhi.

The 75th Meeting of the Executive Committee of National Sports Development Fund (NSDF) was held on 1st March 2019. Secretary (Sports) chaired the Meeting. The list of participants is at Annexure 1.

2. The EC considered the items in the Agenda as explained below:-

General – NSDF Activities:

The EC noted the status of contribution of money to NSDF and utilization of funds for sports activities during 2018-19.

Item 1: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decisions of the 74th Meeting of EC-NSDF, held on 28th January 2019.

EC noted the action taken on various items. On perusal of the ATR, EC noted that the action was complete in respect of following items:

- (i) item No. 1 (11): Assistance to Ms. Mugdha Agre, Badminton player
- (ii) Item No. 2: Decisions of the MOC
- (iii) Item No. 3 Ratification of cases with regard to release of funds from NSDF
- (iv) Item No. 5: Grant of assistance to Shri, P. Gunnaeswaran, tennis Player
- (v) Item No. 6: Grant of Assistance to Ms. Joshua Chinappa, Squash player
- (vi) Item No. 7: Grant of assistance to Shri Saurav Ghosal, Squash Player
- (vii) Item No.8: Grant of assistance to Ms. Anamika Suresh, Archery player
- (viii) Item No. 9: Grant of assistance to Ms. Tarni Goel, Chess Player

In respect of following items, action is pending:

- (i) Item No. 1 (5): About renovation of Wrestling Hall at SAI, Regional centre, Kandivali – File will be submitted by the SP-V Section of the Department for perusal of Secretary (Sports)
- (ii) Item No. 1 (12(ii)): Furnishing of statement of accounts of UC and utilization certificates for block grant given to SAI for various sports infrastructure projects.
- (iii) Item No. 4 (12(iii)) : Utilization of CSR funds received from Coal India Limited; DG, SAI stated that a status note on this subject will be submitted for perusal of Secretary (Sports) within a week.
- (iv) Item No. 4: Status of financial assistance released to SAI for infrastructure

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projects/block grants for TOPS and training etc. SAI has started furnishing the UCs/status of progress of projects.

Item 2 - Decisions of the meetings of the Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) approving financial assistance to the Athletes under TOPS.

The EC noted the decisions taken by the designated committee in Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) approving financial assistance to the Athletes under TOPS in 35th Meeting held on 30.01.2019. Committee was also informed that TOPS/MOC has further finalized list of 23 sportspersons from three disciplines for inclusion in TOPS.

The EC noted the decisions / recommendations of the MOC about the athletes included / retained in the TOPS list.

Item 3 : Financial assistance to Sports Authority of India for support to schools / institutions in the rural areas of Jaipur for providing sports equipment and creation of infrastructure – Gymnastic Halls.

EC considered the proposal for providing financial assistance for construction of Gymnasium Halls and sports equipment to 20 schools / institutions in the Jaipur rural areas (Rajasthan) at a total cost of Rs.6,18,82,000/-. EC was informed that while sports equipments are to be provided to all 20 schools/institutions, gymnasium-halls will be set up in 17 schools/institutions.

EC considered the recommendations of the Infra Division of SAI who also gave technical / financial opinion on the proposal.

The EC decided that the expenditure is to be met out of CSR contribution provided by Power Grid Corporation and Power Finance Corporation who have provided a total of Rs. 6 crore to NSDF with specific condition that the funds are to be spent for sports facilities in Jaipur rural area.

EC noted that the proposal of the two corporations can be covered under the provisions of the NSDF Notification. Accordingly, these funds can be released for the specified object. As regards balance, the funds of Rs. 18,82,000/- will be provided by the NSDF.

EC decided that the assistance of Rs. 6,18,82,000/- be given from NSDF for 20 schools / institutions in rural Jaipur for sports equipment and Gymnasium Hall in 17

schools/institutions. EC decided that the executing agency will be SAI and entire assistance in this regard will be released to SAI who will take further action with regard to procurement of sports equipment and construction of gymnasium halls.

SAI will ensure obtaining written consent from Head of the concerned school/organization before start of construction works.

SAI may get the construction work executed through a suitable agency, which could include concerned local body or the beneficiary organization also.

SAI will satisfy through its regional office in Jaipur about availability of suitable space/playground for use of the sports equipments and construction of gymnasium hall.

Item 4: Financial Assistance to Tangkhul Naga Society, Delhi.

The EC was informed that noted that Tangkhul Naga Society has submitted the proposal to the Ministry on 3rd October 2018 for organizing North East Tamchon Football Tournament in New Delhi from 6-20 October 2018. The proposal was examined in MDS Division of the Ministry, which forwarded the proposal to SAI. As there is no provision in schemes of SAI, no funds have been given by SAI to the Society.

EC was informed that Tangkhul Naga Society has vide its subsequent letter dated 5.2.2019 has requested for assistance of Rs. 10 lakh for meeting the shortfall in the expenditure and funds mobilized from various sponsors. EC decided that since the event is over NSDF to be organized by the Society is already over, funds from NSDF cannot be given for reimbursement of expenditure.

Item 5: Any other item taken with permission of the Chair

Secretary (sports) has taken a presentation in SAI on 1.3.2019 on implementation of Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS). It was explained during presentation that inclusion of sportspersons in TOPS and deletion of sportspersons from TOPS is decided by the Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) headed by Director General, SAI. Detailed analysis of probable Indian sportspersons based on factors like athlete achievements, performance trend, progression, high performance age and comparative analysis with other players / potential international competitors is done for deciding on inclusion of sportspersons in TOPS. Furthermore, a review mechanism is in place, wherein, in addition to the above mentioned criteria, targets and intermediate milestones are fixed for the individuals for their continuation under the scheme.

Sportspersons who fail to achieve the targets despite providing additional support and adequate time are dropped from the scheme. Further a representative of the Department of Sports is also represented in the MOC. Considering this, it was decided that there is no need for taking approval of MOS (I/C) YA&S for inclusion/exclusion of sportspersons in/from TOPS and status quo may be maintained.

ORDER

1. To promote sports and making fitness a way of life, it has been decided to make sports facilities available for sports across the country free of cost.
2. The sports facilities of Sports Authority of India and LNIPE, Gwalior and Guwahati would be made available free of cost for sports in the following order:-
 - i. Sports events and training programmes organized / funded by Department of Sports or its entities. This includes camps / training under ACTC and Khelo India program.
 - ii. Sports events organized by Indian Olympic Association and/or National Sports Federations recognized by the Central Government.
 - iii. Sports events organized by sports leagues and their units registered / recognized by the National Sports Federation recognized by the Central Government.
 - iv. Sports events organised by any Ministry / Department of the Central Government or its Public Sector Units.
 - v. Sports events organized by State Government or its public sector unit or any Sports Association recognised by the State Government.
 - vi. Sports clubs / units belonging to any School / University where a Principal undertakes the responsibility for discipline and proper use of sports facilities.
 - vii. Sports events organized by National Sports Promotion Organizations recognized by the Central Government.
 - viii. Sports events organized by sports clubs registered / recognized by District Sports Officer.
 - ix. Any other sport event permitted by SAI.
 - x. Coaches accredited by Sports Authority of India for training in sports. The guidelines are at Annexure-1.
 - xi. Sportspersons without coach in the following order:
 - a. Olympians and participants in the world championships.
 - b. Medal winners and participants in multilateral competitions.
 - c. Medal winners in national events organised by the Government or NSFs.
 - d. Athletes identified under Khelo India Program for nurturing talent or excellence in sports.
 - e. Medal winners in State level competitions.
 - f. Those already under training in SAI / LNIPE facilities.
 - g. Children below 18 years of age. Inter-se preference would be given to young talent.
 - h. Other Sports persons.

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3. While sports facilities would be made available free of cost the beneficiary would have to bear the following charges:-

- (i) In case of sporting event the organiser would have to pay applicable energy charges, which are Rs.10/KW hour presently. The organizer would have to ensure that after the event the premises are left neat and clean, failing which cleanliness charges @ 200% of actuals would be levied.
- (ii) In case hostel facility is made available, except in case of use for 2(i) above - upkeep and maintenance charge @ Rs. 100/- per athlete per day.
- (iii) In case office space is made available on time sharing basis to coaches - @ Rs. 5000/- per year per coach.
- (iv) For issue of photo identity card for entry to and use of the sports facilities - Rs. 100/- per coach / athlete / trainee per year.
- (v) In case of damage to property and equipment by negligence or deliberate action, cost for repair / replacement.

4. In the event there is more than one request for the same time/day for any sports facility inter-se priority would be decided as per Para 2 above. If there is more than one request from the same category of organizations / persons for the same time / day inter-se priority would be decided on importance and magnitude of the sporting event.

5. The booking for sports facilities whether for any specific event or for regular use would be done online at the web-portal of Sports Authority of India. The booking would be on first come first use basis.

6. The beneficiary would have to submit an undertaking in the form given at Annexure-2.

7. The charges, if any, levied or deposited before coming into force of this order shall not be waived or refunded.

8. This comes into force w.e.f. 01st November 2019.

Annexure-1

Guidelines for Coaches For Use of Sports Facilities Free of Cost

1. Sports facilities would be made available to accredited coaches free of cost for the purpose of sports training.
2. Interested coach would have to apply online at Sports Authority of India (SAI) web portal for accreditation.
3. The following coaches would be accredited on submission of documents without trial and interview:
 - a. Those who have won medals in Olympics, world championship;
 - b. Those who have been conferred the Dronacharya Award;
 - c. Those who have won medals at multilateral international events;
 - d. Those who represented India in Olympics;
 - e. Those who have won medals in national events;
 - f. Those who have won medals at State level events, which are recognized by their respective national federations; and
 - g. Those who hold a degree/diploma from NIS, Patiala.
4. Any coach who does not come in any of the above categories would have to appear for trial/interview to demonstrate his competency to coach. The place and time would be decided by SAI head office.
5. If there is more than one coach desiring the same time slot in any sports facility, inter-se priority would be based on the order of priority of coaches listed in para 3 above and the level of athletes.
6. Conditions:
 - a. Coach would have to have 10 or more athletes under him who take training at the same time slot. In the event a time slot is available, it could be given to a coach having less than 10 but not less than 5 trainee athletes under him with the stipulation that within 3 months he would have minimum 10 trainees under him.
 - b. Regular training being of importance preference would be given to coaches who need time slot on yearly basis.
 - c. Coach is expected to use the time slot allotted to him for at least 20 days in a month, failing which the time slot would be withdrawn and given to other coaches/ athletes.
 - d. Coach remuneration would be a matter between the coach and his trainees. The Government/SAI/LNIPE would give no remuneration to the coach.
 - e. Coach would have to ensure that his trainees abide by the Undertaking submitted by them in the form given at Annexure -2.

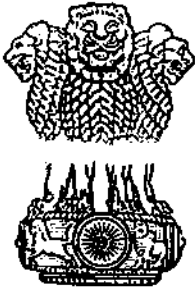

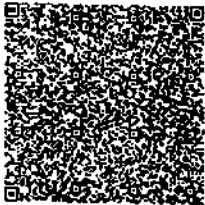

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Deed of License is made this 12th day of February 2020 between the Sports Authority of India (SAI), Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium Complex: Lodhi Road, New Delhi-110003, a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and notified as a Society carried on by and under the authority of Central Government (Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports) (hereinafter

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called the licensor which expression shall mean and include all its successors, assignees and nominees of the first part and Income Tax Department, C.R. Building, I.P. Estate, New Delhi-110002,) (hereinafter called the licensee which expression shall unless context requires, assignees) through its Shri Rajiv Rattan Singh, ACIT(HQ)(Infra) who is duly authorized to execute this deed vide authorization dated 16/01/2020.

Whereas, the Licensor is the Custodian of office space with covered area 79703.16 sq.ft. at the 2nd Floor, Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi-110003.


Whereas, the licensor is the Custodian of office space with covered area measuring 79703.16 sq.ft. (Plinth area including the area of passage, toilet and pillars) Comprising 'office space' hereinafter called the 'office space'.

And whereas, the licensor after considering the request of the licensee has decided to give on license the said Premises/Unit to the Licensee for use as office initially for a period of three (03) years at the monthly license fee @ Rs,518.32/- per sq.ft. per month w.e.f 16.06.2019 to 15.06.2022 and thereafter with increase of 24% every three years. The license fee from 16.06.2019 to 15.06.2022 shall be Rs.4,13,11,742/- (Rupees Four crore Thirteen Lakh Eleven Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Two Only) plus service tax as applicable per month for the floor measuring 79703.16 sq. ft to be increased after every three year @24% on the last paid rent as per CPWD guidelines as amended from time to time binding on the licensee from the use of office purpose.

Now, this deed witnesseth that the licensor in consideration of the licensee does hereby grants the license to the licensee to use the said office space as office accommodation for the period 16.06.2019 to 15.06.2022 on the following terms & conditions:-

1. That the license shall be for a period w.e.f. 16.06.2019 to 15.06.2022 and thereafter it shall be the entire discretion of the licensor to extend or not to extend the period of license. That the license shall be for a period of 03 years with enhancement of license fee after every three years @ 24% on the last paid rent as per CPWD guidelines from time to time in the first instance and for further 5 years on mutual decided terms and conditions and thereafter it shall be the entire discretion of the licensor to renew or not to renew the period of license, in case it is decided by the licensor that the license be renewed, it shall be renewed as per rule of SAI and before its renewal, the Licensee is required to obtain NOC/clearance of the dues from the respective department of the licensor for a further period as decided by the licensor from the day following the date on which the terms of the license expires at a license fee calculated as the rate of license fee payable under the present license plus its renewal charges as may be mutually decided by the licensor and the licensee or by the


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percentage as applicable under the Policy of the SDMC for the time being in force as monthly license fee of the renewed license provided the licensee exercises his/her/their option for renewal of present license and the licensee completes all the required formalities for renewal of license within the stipulated period of 60 days. In case the option for renewal is not so exercised and the formalities are not completed within stipulated period to the satisfaction of other licensor, it shall be presumed that the licensee is not interested in further renewal of his/her/their. License beyond the date of expiry of term of the present license and in the event of the Licensee not surrendering the vacant possession of the premises within the stipulated period under this deed, the licensee shall render himself/herself/themself^s liable for action for eviction and recovery of damages under Public Premises (Eviction of unauthorized Occupants) Act, 1971. A fresh License Agreement shall be executed in the event of renewal.

2. That the licensee will pay the license fee in advance by the 10th of each English Calendar month at the latest along with service tax as applicable (if any). Non-payment of license fee within the prescribed date will constitute breach of the terms of the license and shall render the license deed liable to be revoked. Besides, the licensee shall pay interest @ 12% per annum on the amounts of license fee payable remaining outstanding beyond the due date. Interest shall continue to accrue till the license fee amount is finally squared up. Such interest shall be charged for the full month if the payment of license fee is not made by the due date with arrears, if any. Payment of interest shall be in addition to and without any prejudice to other rights and remedies as may be available to the Licensor under law including right to termination.

3. If the license fee hereby reserved or any party thereof shall at any time be in arrears or remain unpaid after the due date or if the licensee at any time fail or neglect to perform or observe any of the terms and conditions herein contained and on their part to be observed and performed beyond any bonafide reasons and/ or circumstances then in that event the licensor may without prejudice to his general right of revocation of license as a licensor by giving 10 days notice in writing to the licensee detriment the license, and re-renter upon the premises in question or any part thereof and the licensee shall upon such determination peacefully give up possession of the premises in question without any right to compensation whatsoever and thereupon his license shall absolutely determine without prejudice to any right action or remedy of the licensor in respect of any antecedent breach of terms and conditions and covenants on the part of the licensee. That in case license fee, electric charges & maintenance charges, if any, be in arrears shall be recovered as arrears and treated as debt until repaid. Any



penalty charged for non-payment of service tax/any utility charges shall be payable by the Licensee.

4. That without prejudice to the rights and privileges of the licensor, licensee during the tenure of this license shall not transfer, not sub-license/sublet, assign or part with the licensed premises or any portion thereof permanently or temporarily to anybody else and shall not be allowed to take any person to share the accommodation nor in partnership, nor shall they be entitled to allow any person to occupy the licensed premises or to use any part thereof.

5. That the licensed premises shall not be used by the licensee for any other purpose except for the purpose of office and the space shall not be sub-let in any manner to any third party. The license is a bare license to use the said premises/unit and is non-transferable in nature. However, it could not preclude the licensee for setting up a staff canteen for use of officers and staff of the licensee. The area of the canteen will be within the area allocated to IT Deptt. The IT Deptt. may ensure proper safety and hygiene measures with regard to operation and maintenance of canteen. The IT Deptt. will be held solely responsible for any health, cleanliness and fire issue with regard to operation and maintenance of the canteen and liable for payment of damages as decided by the Competent Authority.

5(a) The Licensee shall be free to renovate, refurbish, decorate and install any equipment, furniture, partition, false ceiling etc. as required for the purpose of Licensee's business at their own cost and SAI will not share any expenditure. No damage or any structural changes are to be made by the Licensee in the Demised Premises or any portions thereof. On the termination of the lease the Licensee shall restore the demised premises of its original condition.



6. That the license is revocable for genuine cause involving violation of the terms & conditions of the license at the will of the licensor and does not create or vest any interest of the licensee in the licensed premises. In case the license is revoked before the expiry of the terms of license, in that event, the licensee shall not remove from the licensed premises the furnishings, fittings and fixtures etc. Belonging to the licensee of the type removal of which is likely to cause damage to the building and the same shall belong to the licensor on such terms as may be agreed upon between the parties. In case of the fittings/furnishings, the licensee shall remove the same peacefully and restore the licensed space to the original condition at their own cost. Before invoking this clause, due opportunity shall be given to the licensee to settle the matter to the satisfaction of licensor.

7. That the licensee will be licensed the said premises, equipments, installations, fittings and fixtures on 'as is where is basis' and the licensee shall not make any additions or alterations in the licensed space, installations including electric


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installations and wiring without the prior permission of the licensor in writing and when permitted by the licensor the said additions and alterations shall be carried out by the licensee at their own cost and they shall not be entitled to any compensation for any additions carried out by them in the licensed premises and the same shall vest in the licensor. Licensor shall provide the facilities for internal water supply and sanitary installations. Necessary lights and fan points have been provided by the licensor but other fittings and fans shall be provided by the licensee at their own cost.

8. That the licensee shall not do anything in or outside the licensed premises which may create nuisance or cause any annoyance to the neighbors or to the licensor.
9. That the overall control and supervision ^{of} the premises shall remain vested in the licensor and the licensor through its authorized representatives will have the right to inspect the whole or/part of the licensed premises as and when considered necessary even on short notice, with respect of its bonafide use and in connection with fulfillment of the other terms and conditions of the license.
10. That the licensed premises have been provided with the electrical, sanitary and water supply fittings and the same shall be handed over on 'as is where is basis'. The licensee will have to obtain electric and water connections and would get the load or light and power sanctioned in their name after completing all formalities like deposits of the new connections fee, security etc. and the licensee will bear the electric and water consumption charges by himself. The licensee shall not exceed the sanctioned electric load and if any additional load is required by the licensee over and above that what is installed, the same would be sanctioned subject to its feasibility on receipt of such a request and the work of laying cable etc. , if necessary, would be got done at their own cost to the satisfaction of the licensor. The licensee will also pay water and electric charges of the common toilet and passage on prorata basis of consumption proportionate to the licensed accommodation of the respective licensee.
11. That the licensee shall be responsible for keeping the accommodation licensed to them including the sanitary, water supply and electrical fittings and fixtures in proper conditions and in a manner befitting the building. The licensee shall not damage or cause it to be damaged. In case of any damage the licensee will be liable to compensate the licensor to the extent and for the amount as may be determined by the licensor.
12. That the licensee shall maintain environmental hygiene and proper sanitation of the licensed premises including WCs toilet etc. during all working hours. In this regard, the decision of the MOH, SDMC and SAI shall be final and binding on the licensee.





13. That the lifts installed in the premises shall be available to the licensee every day except Saturdays, Sunday and other holidays as may be declared by the Govt. of India and Delhi Administration from time to time during the hours commencing from 9.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. or as may be determined by the licensor from time to time. The heavy luggage and furniture in any form will not be allowed in the passenger lifts. The lift service before 9.00 a.m. and after 7.00 p.m. on all normal working days and on Saturday, Sunday or other holidays can be provided on the request of the licensee from time to time provided the request is made in writing at least one day in advance. The operation of the same shall maintained by the licensor.
14. The toilets exclusively at the disposal of the licensee, if any, shall be maintained by the licensee at their own cost.
15. That the licensee shall not display any neon sign board or advertisement board etc. except four boards displaying office name (at the place as decided by the Administrator, Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium) without prior written permission of the licensor but licensee shall be responsible to pay the additional license fee for the space that may be licensed for installation of such board etc. besides the advertisement tax or any other charges leviable by the licensor, if any. Neon sign board or advertisement board etc. is installed with the prior written permission of the licensor.
16. That the effective day to day maintenance, watch and ward sanitation of licensed premises including attending to no current complaints from meter onward and routine and periodical maintenance of electrical and other installations will be responsibility of the licensee. The licensee shall have to engage adequate number of technicians for effective maintenance. In the event of the failure of the licensee to carry out effective day to day maintenance of the premises to the satisfaction of the licensor or any repair which the licensor may consider should be carried out without delay or loss of time to avoid wastage of water/electricity and damage to the Government Property, the responsibility of which is otherwise that of the licensee, the licensor may get the work done on behalf of the licensee and in that event the licensee shall pay to the licensor the cost including departmental charges incurred in this behalf. The licensee shall maintain the electrical installations as per Indian Electricity Rules and shall abide by the provisions of the Electricity Control Act (s) enforced from time to time.
17. That the licensor shall carry out annual repair to the licensed premises which shall mean only once in every two year white and colour wash in fashion and in the manner the same is done at the time of the grant of license. White paint work and polishing of the wood work in the premises as are now painted and polished will be done once in every three years.



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
18. That in the event of the license having been terminated earlier in terms of the relevant clause of the license deed or the license on expiry having not been renewed, the licensee shall vacate the premises under license in a peaceful manner. The licensee shall also be responsible for making good for damages, losses etc. to the licensed premises, fittings and fixtures noticed by the licensor at the time of vacating the licensed premises by the licensee except for depreciation arising out of normal wear, tear and usage. The decision of the licensor as to the extent of damages within 30 days of the notice of revocation of the license by the licensor and shall not claim any compensation for any resultant injury thereof.
19. That in case the license is cancelled by the licensor and/or on expiry of license period, the unauthorized occupant of the premises viz., erstwhile licensee together with all other unauthorized occupants, if any, shall be liable to pay the damages at the rates as may be determined by the licensor. Besides, an interest at the rate of @ 12% per annum shall be payable on the sum calculated as damages, if damage charges as determined by the licensor are not deposited with Administrator, Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium for each Calendar Month.
20. That any communication or notice on behalf of the licensor in relation to the license may be issued to the licensee by an officer of the licensor and all such communications and notices may be served on the licensee either by registered post or under certificate of posting or by ordinary post or by hand delivery at the last known address of the licensee or by pasting the same at the conspicuous part of the licensed premises shall be deemed to be due service on the licensee even if the said communication is received back undelivered/unserved on any ground whatsoever.
21. That the licensee shall obtain information and make all arrangements/provisions necessary for fire prevention and fire safety arrangements as may be prescribed by the Chief Fire Officer or nay other code/standard practice or nay other competent authority in this behalf at his own cost. The licensee shall carry out the work of providing the fire prevention and fire safety measures to the full satisfaction of the Chief Fire officer, Delhi or any other competent authority in this respect. In the event of the failure of the licensee to do the needful, the licensor may get the work done for and on behalf of the licensee and in that event then licensee shall pay to the licensor the entire costs. (including the departmental charges) incurred in this behalf. After installation of the fire preventive and fire safety equipments in the premises as per the requirements of the Chief Fire Officer, or any or any other competent authority in this respect, the licensor shall maintain and operate the fire prevention and fire safety arrangements/system in the building. The licensee shall pay the service charges


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for the services rendered by the licensor for operation and maintenance of the fire prevention and fire safety arrangements on proportionate area basis in addition to the license fee determined for the premises. The non-payment of the service charges on this account shall be treated as breach of terms and conditions of license and shall render the license liable to be revoked/cancelled.

- 22. That the licensee shall be bound to abide by all the provisions of the New Delhi Municipal Council Act, 1994 by-laws made there under from time to time existing or hereafter made, and such other central/local laws and rules and regulations existing herein or to be enacted or introduced hereafter.
- 23. Notwithstanding anything contained in any clause heretofore mentioned the licensor shall have the absolute right at all times to undertake any additional construction to ensure better utilization of other building and to improve its revenue and the licensee shall not claim any reduction in agreed license fee on this account.
- 24. The breach of any of these conditions will make the license liable to cancellation with immediate effect notwithstanding the provisions contained in condition NO.1 hereof and eviction of the licensee on revocation/cancellation of the license. It shall be the duty of the licensee to quit the licensed premises within the time given in the communication issued by the licensor in this respect. In case, the licensee fails to quit the premises within the stipulated period, the licensor shall be entitled to charge/recover damages at the rates as may be determined by the licensor. The event of the licensee desirous of surrendering the licensed space before the expiry of the term of the license, they can do so by giving three months notice in writing terminating their liability on the date of expiry of the said notice or on the date of handing over the possession of the licensed premises whichever is later, provided the outgoing licensee before handing over the possession clear all the SAI dues including damages charges, if any. Clearance of the dues will be essential condition for acceptance of the notice. In the event of non-payment of the dues before the date of expiry of notice period, the time taken in clearing the SAI dues will automatically postpone the date of notice period and the period of license in that event will expires on the date of the clearance of the dues.
- 25. That the license shall stand ipso-facto determined without any right to compensation whatsoever to the license, if the licensee shall pass a Resolution to wind up the business of the Company or the court shall make an order for liquidation of its affairs or a Receiver or Manager on behalf of the debenture holders shall be appointed or circumstances shall have arisen which entitle the court or debenture holders to appoint a receiver or Manager. Provided always that such a determination shall not prejudice any right of action or remedy which



- shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrued or shall thereafter accrue to the licensor.
26. That the Estate Officer, MYAS New Delhi, only shall have jurisdiction to entertain any application in respect of any proceedings under this agreement or to entertain any suit in connection with this agreement of license and no other court of any other place shall have jurisdiction to entertain any such application or any suit.
 27. In case of any national/international sports event or mega non-sports events being held in the Stadium, and it becomes necessary to close the normal entrance to the premises occupied by the licensee to prevent entry of any unauthorized person(s) without ticket/invitation/pass, then separate entry arrangements shall be made during the period when such national/international event or mega non-sports events is held in compliance with mandatory requirements of the organizers and those of the concerned police authorities and security agencies.
 28. The licensee shall not encroach upon any area of vacant land or constructed portion for any purpose.
 29. The Licensee shall arrange for removal of the garbage, or any other type of refuse or waste material every day at its own cost in respect of licensed premises.
 30. That the licensee shall not call in question or raise any dispute regarding quantum of license fee as agreed to either before the SAI or before any Court of Law. If the licensee raises such dispute, he shall render his license to be cancelled forthwith.
 31. That the breach of any of these conditions will entitle the licensor to cancel the allotment and disconnection of electricity connection provided and sealing the premises for further use.

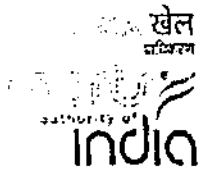
