The culture of sports and education along with discipline embedded in public School being run by Assam Rifles and the Indian Army. In order to promote sports at grassroot level Assam Rifles Public School (Sports) Laitkor, Shillong-10 ARPS is adopted in 14th DPAC meeting held on 03.01.2020 under the "Khelo India Centre and Sports Academics" Component of Khelo India scheme.

Assam Rifles Public School

- 1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between SAI and ARPS was signed on 01st January 2021 for a period of 03 years, which expired on 01 Jan 2024. The 46th DPAC held on 07.06.2024 has accorded approval for the extension of tenure of Assam Rifles Public School, Laitkor, Shillong under the Khelo India Scheme, as per the existing financial norms i.e., until the end of FY 2024-25. Also, no new induction to be done in the school under Khelo India scheme during this period.
- 2. It is pertinent to mention that the financial norms for ARPS (under sports schools) @ Rs. 1.5 lacs per athlete per annum was approved in the 27th DPAC held on 13.05.2021. The norms were further revised vide Notification dated 27.03.2023 and were within the overall ceiling of Rs. 1.5 lacs per athlete p.a. attached as Annexure-I(A).
- 3. With reference to 46th DPAC held on 07.06.2024 has accorded approval for revision of Boarding Charges enhanced by 10 % under SAI Sports premotion scheme for (ABSC, STC, SAG, COE and NSA) issued vide file No 74th/SAI/Ops/62 MTS/FC Meeting/ 2016-17 / 630 dated 28.07. 2016, attached as Annexure-I(B). Vide the said SAI sports premotion scheme, it was decided to enhance the boarding charges by 10 % once in every two years. In line with the revisions for ABSC, the proposed revised boarding charges for ARPS are tabulated below. Boarding charges for STCs were revised in May 2024, as well.

The Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) is a key initiative under the Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies component of the Khelo India Scheme. This program is part of India's strategic effort to achieve excellence in the Olympics. Its primary goal is to elevate the most promising state-run sports training centre to world-class standards, fostering athlete development and strengthening competitive edge on the global stage.

- 1. In this regard proposal was received vide letter dated 01.03.2023 received from the Secretary, Rajasthan State Sports Council (RSSC), Govt. of Rajasthan.
- 2. The proposal to establish **Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE)** at **Sawai Man Singh Stadium**, **Jaipur** for Athletics, Archery, and Boxing was received from the **Rajasthan State Sports Council (RSSC)** and after conducting inspection, the technical feasibility reports were submitted and the centre was recommended by **SAI RC Gandhinagar**.
- 3. In view of the above, detailed discussions/meetings with the officials of RSSC, SAI **RC Gandhinagar**, and Khelo India, the Viability Gap Funding for the received proposal was finalized filling up the critical gaps in sports science resource, equipment and facets of the centre. Thus budget for the KISCE Rajasthan was deliberated and outlined in table below:

5. It is also submitted that the centre is yet to be notified as KISCE for the State of Rajasthan.

6. In view of the above, approval of the DPAC is sought for notifying Sawai Mann Singh Stadium, Jaipur as KISCE for Athletics, Archery and Boxing for the State of Rajasthan and for an amount of INR 2,84,97,668/-(Recurring Grant of INR 75,53,565/- and Non-Recurring Grant of INR 2,09,44,103/-) for FY 2024-25 and INR 1,29,68,565/- as a Recurring Grant for subsequent years for funding the proposed KISCE at Jaipur, State of Rajasthan.

The Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) component is aimed at providing "Viability Gap Funding" to one shortlisted training centre in each State/UT for the following components:

- i. Sports science and technology support for (three) sports disciplines practised at the centre.
- ii. Bridging the gaps in sports equipment, high-performance managers, coaches, etc.
 - 2. The said project is a part of India's pursuit of excellence in the Olympics and the endeavour is to scale up State's / UT's best academies to world standard. As of now 33 KISCEs have been notified in 32 States/UTs.
 - 3. As per the discussion between the Secretary (Sports), MYAS, GoI and DG, SAI, it was decided to create a benchmarking system for KISCEs, bringing them at par with SAI NCOEs. Further, a discussion was held by DG, SAI dated 20.08.2024 with DDG (Operations), ED (Operations), Director (NCSSR), Director (Khelo India), other NCOE and KISCE Team Members in which it was decided to conduct Capacity Building Program for manpower hired in KISCE.
 - 4. Accordingly, a proposed outline for the conduct of 06-day Capacity Building Program incorporating diet, nutrition, athlete management software and performance monitoring was drafted by HPD (Khelo India) in consultation with SAI NSNIS Patiala.
 - 5. As per the recommendation of NSNIS Patiala, the courses available and could be made useful for only Sports specific posts. Thus, a total of 304 Sports specific positions(manpower) are sanctioned in 33 KISCEs out of which 135 position (manpower) have been successfully recruited.
 - 6. Based on the above, the following budget is being proposed in consultation with SAI NSNIS Patiala for 135 hired manpower as participants. The post wise count is placed at Annexure III:

As per the mandate of the Khelo India Scheme, The Khelo India Centres & Sports Academies is a key component of the revamped Khelo India National Programme for the Development of Sports. It aims to establish Khelo India Centres (KICs) nationwide to fully utilize existing sports infrastructure. To strengthen grassroots sports development.

- 2. The launch event dedicating the Khelo India Centres (KICs) of Rajasthan to the nation was held on August 23, 2023, in Jaipur, Rajasthan. The event witnessed the esteemed presence of the Hon'ble Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India, and the Hon'ble Minister for Sports, Government of Rajasthan.
- 3. This significant launch not only marked the establishment of district-level centres equipped with sports infrastructure and professional coaching staff but also created widespread awareness about grassroots sports development. The event received extensive coverage across social media and print media platforms, significantly amplifying its reach and awareness among masses.
- 4. In this regard, a letter dated 22-Aug-2023 was sent to the Principal Secretary, Govt. of Rajasthan regarding the above-mentioned program and to make necessary arrangements for the launch event. Attached as (Annexure-IV).
- 5. Subsequently, it was informed by SAI NSWC Gandhinagar that an amount of INR 7,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs) will be required for making necessary arrangements for the launch event and the same was put up for approval of the Competent Authority, SAI HO. Accordingly, Director General, SAI HO had directed to put up the same before DPAC for approval.
- 6. In view of the above, ex- post facto approval is solicited for releasing of INR 7,00,000 (Rupees Seven Lakhs) as reimbursement of One-Time Grant to SAI NSWC Gandhinagar for the launch event of KICs in Rajasthan.

18th DPAC dated 04.06.2020 had decided to establish 1,000 Khelo India Centres across the country over the next four years, aiming to set up Khelo India Centres in each district across every State and Union Territory.

During 34th DPAC dated 24.05.2022, KIC at Rohtak was approved in Athletics discipline at Sir Chhotu Ram Stadium, Rohtak. However, the center was shifted and made operational at Arjun Stadium, Jind District. The Department of Sports, Haryana, changed the location of the notified KIC from Rohtak to Jind without obtaining prior approval from SAI, which came to light during a field inspection from Regional centre, Sonepat.

However prior to that, during the 47th DPAC dated 26.09.2024, another KIC was approved at FS Convent School, Jind District, for the Archery discipline. This scenario contadicts the existing guideline where in one district is to have one KIC.

In view of the above, In principal approval of DPAC Chairperson has been obtained for de-notification of additional KIC **at Jind district** on the grounds of non-compliance. The State has been informed about denotification of Archery KIC in Jind and also conveyed to submit proposal for KIC at Rohtak District so that it will help coverage of all districts in Haryana under KICs.

Agenda is placed for ratification of the same.

Under the component of Sports Competitions and Talent Development of Khelo India Scheme mentioned in the Gazette Notification dated 4 March 2022. It is mentioned that the Central Government will organize National-level competitions in respect of high priority/priority sports disciplines. The 2nd edition of Khelo India Para Games (KIPG) 2025 are scheduled to be held in New Delhi in the month of March 2025, across three SAI Stadia in Delhi namely, Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium (JNS), Indira Gandhi Stadium (IGS) and Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Ranges (KSSR). The Games are expected to attract 2500 participants including approx. 1200 athletes. It is envisaged to conduct the Khelo India Para Games at par with International Standards, giving the experience of major multidisciplinary Para-Games to para-athletes of the country to create future champions.

- 2. It may be noted that DPAC in its 48th Meeting approved a budget of Rs.120 Cr (approx.) for Khelo India Games, 2025 including **Rs 19.01** Cr for KIPG, 2025 wherein the approved budget was bifurcated between Host State and SAI for an amount of Rs 8.48 Cr.and Rs10.53 Cr. respectively. (Copy of Agenda and Minutes placed at **Annexure V**).
- 3. However, as per latest developments and approval by competent authority, the Khelo India Para Games 2025 are scheduled to be held in March 2025 in Delhi and the role of Host would be assumed by Khelo India Division, Sports Authority of India. In light of this development, and considering that the responsibilities of the Host State now rest with SAI for the successful conduct of the second edition of the Khelo India Para Games, in SAI Stadia Delhi. It is proposed that the budget be revised to account for changes in budget for functional areas such as ceremonies, accommodation and catering, transportation, medical and insurance, volunteers and sports equipment, etc.
- 4. In view of the above consideration addition to the Rs 19.01 Cr as approved in 48th DPAC meeting, an additional amount of Rs. 16.27 Cr. Would be required as per details mentioned below:

The Fit India Mission was launched in 2019 by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi with a view to make fitness an integral part of our daily lives. Taking the movement forward, the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour and Employment launched the Fit India Cycling Drive on 17th December 2024 at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in the presence of over 500 cycling enthusiasts. The cycling drive now being conducted under the #SundaysOnCycle campaign from 22nd December 2024 onwards has taken place in over 2700+ locations across the country with participation of approx. 1,20,000 cyclists making it one of the biggest cycling activities. The #CyclingTuesdays& #SundaysOnCycle campaign has also found mention in the 117th episode of Mann Ki Baat by Hon'ble Prime Minister, highlighting the importance being given to promoting fitness and health across the nation.

- 2. Further, it is envisaged to undertake the drive with various sections of the society across different age groups, gender, professions, etc. to create awareness about the importance of fitness, environment and healthy living for a Greener & Fitter India marching its way towards Viksit Bharat.
- 3. The Sundays on Cycle campaign is being held by various stakeholders like SAI Regional Centres, Khelo India Centres, Bicycle groups across the country with the participation of athletes, paramilitary forces, NGOs, cycling enthusiasts, etc. Further, the campaign is to be conducted every Sunday in New Delhi with the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports leading the campaign whenever possible and other eminent personalities in attendance with the participation of various groups. It shall also be the endeavour of the campaign to promote public messages like- Say no to Drugs, etc during the cycling ride.
- 4. Accordingly, it is proposed to allocate a budget of Rs 65 lacs (i.e. Rs 5 lac per week) for conducting the Sundays on Cycle campaign in New Delhi till 31st March 2025. Further, for the event being planned on 9th February 2025, where the cycling activity will be held with Postmen/women in the presence of the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs an additional amount of Rs 10 lacs may be allocated in addition to the allotted amount of Rs 5 lacs. This takes the total cost for the Fit India Cycling Drive to Rs 75 lacs till FY 2024-25.
- 5. Further, DG SAI may be empowered to make appropriate funds within the overall limit of Rs 75 lacs.

The budget allocation may be made under Fit India vertical of Khelo India.

Cycling is one of the easiest ways to fit exercise into your daily routine and helps holistically build strength as every single part of the body is involved, building stamina and reducing stress. *Cycling as a fitness activity is in tune with the message of our Hon'ble Prime Minister of "Fitness ki dose, aadha ghanta roz"*. Further, with the rising pollution levels, Cycling can act as a solution to the existing problem of pollution.

- 2. The Fit India Cycling Drive was launched by the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium on 17th December 2024 and a nationwide cycling campaign was conducted in over 1000 locations. During the launch, the *Sundays on Cycles campaign* was initiated, wherein individuals and groups will be encouraged to undertake cycling every Sunday. A Sundays on Cycle campaign was held on 22nd Dec 2024 at over 1100 locations with the participation of over 50000 participants. With rising pollution levels, cycling can act as the best solution to the problem of pollution alongside being a sustainable physical fitness activity. This campaign will also act as a catalyst and help promote a "Green, Fit India campaign," which is expected to be a continuing activity.
- 3. Further, the Regional Centres of Sports Authority of India, located at 12 locations across the country are large residential sports campuses spread between 30-100 acres with athletes, coaches and support staff training and residing in them. Bicycles can be an eco-sustainable and non-polluting mode of travel within and beyond the Regional Centre. Further, with the 'Fit India Sundays on Cycle' campaign becoming a permanent fixture, provisioning of bicycles at Regional Centres will aid in conducting and promoting nationwide cycling events.

In view of the above, it is proposed that SAI Regional Centres purchase 50 bicycles each along with safety helmets for in-campus use and also during the Sundays on Cycle campaign. The expenditure will be incurred under the Fit India component of the Khelo India Scheme.

4. Financial Implication: The proposed estimated expenditure for the above proposal is as tabulated below:

Reference is invited to the meetings held by the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour & Employment on 18.10.2024, 24.10.2024 and 16.12.2024 wherein it was directed to create anthem and TVC for Fit India Movement. This assumes significance due to the need to strengthen the Fit India brand and conduct campaigns, activities, etc for the promotion of healthy and fit lifestyle. Creation of anthem and TVC will aid in better brand association and enhance the visibility of the Fit India Movement.

- 2. Further, under the leadership of the Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports, the Sundays on Cycle campaign has been launched to promote cycling as a sustainable and physical fitness activity. The campaign has witnessed a participation of over 1.2 lakh citizens from over 2700 locations. The Sundays on Cycle campaign has also found mention in the 117th episode of Mann Ki Baat by the Hon'ble Prime Minister.
- 3. With this spirit, to further bolster and take the movement to the masses, it is proposed to create the following:
- Revised Fit India Anthem (around 120 secs)
- TV Commercial for Fit India Sundays on Cycle campaign (120 secs)

Accordingly, taking into account the rates fixed by the DIRECTORATE OF ADVERTISING & VISUAL PUBLICITY (DAVP) under Central Bureau of Communication, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India, for production of creatives, both audio and video, the financial implication for the above proposed activity is as mentioned below-

4. Further, under **GFR 194**, Single Source Selection/Consultancy by nomination- the selection by direct negotiation/nomination, on the lines of Single Tender mode of procurement of goods, is considered appropriate only under exceptional circumstance such as:







- (i) Tasks that represent a natural continuation of previous work carried out by the firm;
- (ii) In case of an emergency situation, situations arising after natural disasters, situations where timely completion of the assignment is of utmost importance; and
- (iii) Situations where execution of the assignment may involve use of proprietary techniques or only one consultant has requisite expertise.
- (iv) Under some special circumstances, it may become necessary to select a particular consultant where adequate justification is available for such single-source selection in the context of the overall interest of the Ministry or Department. Full justification for single source selection should be recorded in the file and approval of the competent authority obtained before resorting to such single-source selection.

It shall ensure fairness and equity and shall have a procedure in place to ensure that the prices are reasonable and consistent with market rates for tasks of a similar nature; and the required consultancy services are not split into smaller sized procurement.

5.In this regard, it is submitted that the Central Bureau of Communication (CBC) under the Ministry of Information of Broadcasting, Government of India has been mandated to undertake branding of the Government as prime facilitator of people's empowerment and positioning of messages through Print, Audio-Visual, Outdoor, Digital Media to realize the same. The CBC disseminates information about various schemes and policies of different Ministries & Departments of Government of India, Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and autonomous bodies. It is pertinent to mention that the Sports Authority of India has undertaken various engagements with the CBC earlier during previous editions of Khelo India Games and various other promotional campaigns including Asian Games 2022, KIRTI, Olympics campaigns, etc to maximize the outreach and promotion of various messages.

- 6. Accordingly, it is proposed to engage the services of Central Bureau of Communication (CBC) under the Ministry of Information of Broadcasting, Government of India for the production of the content mentioned in Para 3 and the work be allotted to CBC since it is a government entity mandated to disseminate information about various schemes and policies of government. Hence, the GFR rule 194 (iv) mentioned in para 4 above can be applied and invoked for selection of Central Bureau of Communication (CBC) under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India on nomination basis for an estimated cost of Rs 33,04,000/- inclusive of GST.
- 7. The above proposal was put-up and approval of Competent Authority was obtained on file for the following:
- a. Approval for award of work to the Central Bureau of Communication (CBC) under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India on nomination basis for the creation of anthem of Fit India and TVC for Sundays on Cycle for an estimated cost of Rs. 33,04,000/- (inclusive of GST), from the budget available under Fit India.
 - If approved, work order will be issued to CBC and the same will be placed before DPAC for ratification.
- b. Issuing work order to CBC for executing the above-mentioned services.
