The athletes are provided with Lodging, Boarding for 320 days (Unlimited), Sports Kit, Competition Exposure, Education Expense, and Miscellaneous expenses.

Adopted Akharas under National Sports Talent Contest Scheme (NSTC)

Wrestling has been a traditional indigenous sport in the country and mostly played at village level. India has won many international medals in the past and has been a force to reckon with. Therefore, efforts are being made to create a broader base for modern wrestling and supplement the efforts made by various akharas in the country. The details of SAI Centres in the state of Maharashtra are provided at **Annexure - I.** Further, for promotion of sports in the country, SAI spends funds through its Regional Centres only. Also, an Annual Recurring Grant of INR 5 lakhs per discipline is provided as a remuneration to coach/past champion athlete, support staff, purchase of sports equipment, sports kit, consumables, competition/event participation, etc. Maximum remuneration permitted per past champion athlete would be INR 3 lakhs per year.

Further, positive impact on youth participation and the development of young athletes at the grassroots level are as follows:

A. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies:

Under this component of the Khelo India Scheme, Khelo India Centres (KICs) have been setup with the following objectives:

- i) Providing sports training/coaching to willing children.
- ii) Providing sustainable source of livelihood outside the Government set-up to past champion athletes.
- iii) To strengthen the sports ecosystem at the grassroots level by augmenting the utilisation of existing sports infrastructure available at State, PSU, autonomous bodies, Schools, Universities and other organisations.

Current Status:

- i) A total of **1045 KICs** across the country have been notified till date across 36 States/UTs, out of which **938** KICs are currently operational and training **27,911** athletes.
- ii) As part of the capacity building initiatives, 691 (registered) Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) have been trained to inculcate correct techniques required for grassroots level training, which shall help in broad-basing the grassroots talent & act as a feeder.
- iii) 34 KISCE in 33 states with manpower 433 sanctioned filling critical gaps in manpower, sports equipment and sports science equipment. facilitating training 2279 of athletes with emphasis on ONE STATE ONE GAME.

B. Sports Competitions and Talent Development

The Khelo India Scheme through Khelo India Talent Development identifies KIAs (Khelo India Athletes) across 21 Sports including para-Sports, and nurtures them through supporting ecosystem in a Consent based approach leaving the freedom of choosing place of training to athletes.

The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks laid down in the Protocols. In consonance with these protocols, a specialised committee namely the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC) comprising of Olympians, prominent athletes, coaches of a particular sport are deputed to competitions wherein they identify deserving players and compile a Scouting List. Athletes selected are called for Assessment Camps and a final list of selected athletes is prepared in line with the protocols and the vacancies. The final induction of these athletes into the Khelo India Scheme as Khelo India Athletes is done after the approval of all TIDC members and the Competent Authority. The maximum approved number is 3000 athletes, out of which there are currently 2845 identified.

The Khelo India program provides comprehensive support to athletes, including scholarships, specialised training and coaching facilities, exposure to international competitions, and access to world-class training facilities, which entail funding of ₹6.28 lakhs per annum per Khelo India Athlete (includes ₹10,000 per month out-of-pocket allowance for each KIA) as follows:

- a) **OPA:** Khelo India provides scholarships worth ₹10,000 per month to talented athletes, ensuring they can focus on their training without financial burdens.
- b) Support through Accredited Academy (per Annum per KIA): Athletes have access to state-of-the-art training facilities, including sports complexes and academies, especially 301 Accredited Academies across the country. For facilitating training of KIA, Accredited academy is majorly supported as under:

		Khelo India sports competitions is the platform to showcase sporting skills and overtime became a platform for talent spotting and providing development pathways for talented children to achieve excellence. The component has following components: i. Sports Competition ii. Talent Identification and Development
		i. Sports Competition:
		Under this component, national-level competitions, i.e., Khelo India Youth Games , which focusses on athletes under 18, offering a large-scale platform annually for young athletes and the Khelo India University Games , which focuses on enhancing sports

performance among university-level athletes are held for high priority, priority, indigenous, other sports disciplines. In addition, the **Khelo India Winter Games**, are organized for winter sports in regions like Jammu & Kashmir and Leh-Ladakh; and the first edition (2023) of **Khelo India Para Games** have been organised which promotes inclusiveness by creating opportunities for athletes with disabilities.

As of now, 16 editions of Khelo India Games have been organized viz 06 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 05 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG), 04 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) and 01 Khelo India Para Games (KIPG). These games have witnessed a total participation of more than 48,639 athletes.

ii. Talent Development:

The component of Talent Development facilitates identification of talented athletes (Khelo India Athletes) and nurtures them through multifaceted support. The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks made by Talent Identification and Development Committee Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for training purpose. The KIAs who train in the Khelo India accredited academies are entitled for the financial support in tune of Rs. 6.28 Lakhs per annum and inclusive of Rs. 10,000/- per month as Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA). Total **2845 KIAs** are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around 306 academies have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

- **2. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies:** KICs and Sports Academies were created to support better utilization of sports infrastructure belonging to States/UTs and provide support for engagement of coaches, etc. It includes the provision of maximum funding to the State Centres of Excellence and Khelo India Centres under the "One State, One Game" initiative. The emphasis is on upgradation of sports science facilities and sports science resources; providing livelihood to past champion athletes (PCAs), capacity building and Viability Gap Funding support.
- **a. KICs -** KICs are set up with an objective of facilitating training for willing children, providing livelihood opportunities to Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) as coaches and to augment the utilisation of existing

infrastructure. A target of 1250 KICs is to be achieved across the country with initial coverage of one KIC per district. As on date there are 1045 KICs notified across the country out of which 938 KICs are currently operational.

- **b. KISCE:** Khelo India state Centre of Excellence is an initiative to fill the critical gaps in the state/UT's facility by providing customised support through Viability Gap Funding towards Equipment (Sports Science, Strength & Conditioning) and high quality manpower (Coaching, Sports Science). In the current scheme, the target is to set up one KISCE in each state/UT. Currently, 34 KISCEs have been notified across 33 States/UTs.
- **3. Fit India Movement :** The Fit India Movement was launched by the Prime Minister of India on August 29, 2019, with the vision to promote healthier lifestyles by encouraging individuals and communities to incorporate physical activity and sports into their daily routines. Activities are being ensured across the country including LTTs

A). Fit India Mobile App:

The Fit India Mobile App (FIMA) is a distinctive platform enabling citizens to assess their fitness levels through simple tests and receive regular wellness tips With approx 10 lakh downloads on Android and iOS,

B). Sundays on Cycle:

The Fit India Cycling Drive is another key initiative under the Fit India Mission, aimed at promoting cycling as an integral part of maintaining physical fitness. The campaign was officially launched on December 17, 2024, at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi. During the launch, the *Sundays on Cycles* campaign was introduced, encouraging individuals and groups to cycle every Sunday starting from December 17, 2024. The nationwide cycling campaign has already seen the participation of over 1.7 lakh citizens, with cycling activities taking place at over 4200 locations, and the campaign is still ongoing.

<u>4. Inclusiveness in Sports</u>: This component focuses on making sports accessible to all, especially promoting sports for women, persons with disabilities, marginalized communities, and supporting rural/indigenous games.

Sports for Women: Khelo India Women League was started in 2021 to offer opportunities to women for participating & excelling in sporting activities - named as ASMITA League which Stands for "Achieving Sports Milestone by Inspiring Women Through Action". Under this initiative, various Khelo India Women's League – are being conducted. As of now women leagues have been organised in 21 sports disciplines across the country. Total 1030 competitions have been organized for Women athletes with 114153 participants. This initiative has significantly increased women participation in sports across the nation and has

Fit India Movement 5. Promotion of Inclusiveness through Sports

Yes Sir

The government provides financial assistance and support for sports through various national schemes, including the Khelo India Programme, which is aimed at promoting sports at the grassroots level. Under these schemes, financial support is provided for the promotion, development, and popularization of sports, including the establishment of training centers, coaching, and the organization of national championships.

Several initiatives are taken to promote kabaddi:

- 1. 2845 Khelo India Athletes are getting supported under Khelo India Scheme, out of which there are 99 KIAs are getting supported in the discipline Kabaddi. The list is attached as **Annexure II**.
- 2. Khelo India Centre: (1045 Notified) at the district level across the country provide opportunity for the children to be trained by a past champion athlete and aid their preparation for participation in state/national level tournaments

As of now, 47 centres have been notified as Khelo India Centres (KICs) in the discipline of Kabaddi. The list is provided at Annexure - III.

- 3. there are 8 Khelo India Accredited academies with the discipline Kabaddi. The list is provided at **Annexure IV.**
- 4. 16 Editions of Khelo India Games have been conducted so far, which act as platform for athletes, including athletes from both urban and rural areas where Kabaddi is an integral part of games in KIYG and KIUG.

Apart from above, the Government of India, through the Sports Authority of India (SAI), provides extensive support to athletes across various sports. Kabaddi is a priority sport, and the government ensures financial assistance, training, and infrastructure development to nurture talent. Prize money and incentives are also provided to outstanding performers in national and international competitions. Under the Khelo India Scheme, 99 athletes in Kabaddi are currently supported, with a sanctioned strength of 100. This support is provided under the Assistance to National Sports Federations (ANSF) scheme, ensuring that athletes receive the necessary resources to compete at the highest level.

National training camps and international exposure opportunities are provided to enhance the performance of

athletes. Recently, a Women's National Camp for the Asian
Kabaddi Championship (Iran) was conducted in Sonepat
with an allocated budget of ₹21 lakh, while ₹30,43,200 was
sanctioned for foreign exposure for the championship.

Khelo India Scheme:

With a view to achieving the twin objectives of mass participation and promotion of excellence in sports, The Khelo India Scheme was launched on 14th October 2017. It is divided into five components:

- 6. Creation and Upgradation of Sports Infrastructure
- 7. Sports Competitions and Talent Development
- 8. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies
- 9. Fit India Movement
- 10. Promotion of Inclusiveness through Sports

Detailed in respect of Khelo India Scheme components are as follows:

2. Sports Competitions and Talent Development

Khelo India sports competitions is the platform to showcase sporting skills and overtime became a platform for talent spotting and providing development pathways for talented children to achieve excellence. The component has following components:

- iii. Sports Competition
- iv. Talent Identification and Development

i. Sports Competition:

Under this component, national-level competitions, i.e., **Khelo India Youth Games**, which focusses on athletes under 18, offering a large-scale platform annually for young athletes and the **Khelo India University Games**, which focuses on enhancing sports performance among university-level athletes are held for high priority, priority, indigenous, other sports disciplines. In addition, the **Khelo India Winter Games**, are organized for winter sports in regions like Jammu & Kashmir and Leh-Ladakh; and the first edition (2023) of **Khelo India Para Games** have been organised which promotes inclusiveness by creating opportunities for athletes with disabilities.

As of now, 16 editions of Khelo India Games have been organized viz 06 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 05 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG), 04 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) and 01 Khelo India Para Games (KIPG). These games have witnessed a total participation of more than 48,639 athletes.

ii. Talent Development:

The component of Talent Development facilitates identification of talented athletes (Khelo India Athletes) and nurtures them through multifaceted support. The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks made by Talent Identification and Development Committee Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for training purpose. The KIAs who train in the Khelo India accredited academies are entitled for the financial support in tune of Rs. 6.28 Lakhs per annum and inclusive of Rs. 10,000/- per month as Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA). Total **2845 KIAs**

are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around **306 academies** have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

- **2. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies:** KICs and Sports Academies were created to support better utilization of sports infrastructure belonging to States/UTs and provide support for engagement of coaches, etc. It includes the provision of maximum funding to the State Centres of Excellence and Khelo India Centres under the "One State, One Game" initiative. The emphasis is on upgradation of sports science facilities and sports science resources; providing livelihood to past champion athletes (PCAs), capacity building and Viability Gap Funding support.
- **a.** KICs KICs are set up with an objective of facilitating training for willing children, providing livelihood opportunities to Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) as coaches and to augment the utilisation of existing infrastructure. A target of 1250 KICs is to be achieved across the country with initial coverage of one KIC per district.. As on date there are **1045** KICs notified across the country out of which **938** KICs are currently operational.
- **b. KISCE:** Khelo India state Centre of Excellence is an initiative to fill the critical gaps in the state/UT's facility by providing customised support through Viability Gap Funding towards Equipment (Sports Science, Strength & Conditioning) and high quality manpower (Coaching, Sports Science). In the current scheme, the target is to set up one KISCE in each state/UT. Currently, 34 KISCEs have been notified across 33 States/UTs.
- **3. Fit India Movement :** The Fit India Movement was launched by the Prime Minister of India on August 29, 2019, with the vision to promote healthier lifestyles by encouraging individuals and communities to incorporate physical activity and sports into their daily routines. Activities are being ensured across the country including UTs.

A). Fit India Mobile App:

The Fit India Mobile App (FIMA) is a distinctive platform enabling citizens to assess their fitness levels through simple tests and receive regular wellness tips with approx 10 lakh downloads on Android and iOS,

B). Sundays on Cycle:

The Fit India Cycling Drive is another key initiative under the Fit India Mission, aimed at promoting cycling as an integral part of maintaining physical fitness. The campaign was officially launched on December 17, 2024, at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi. During the launch, the *Sundays on Cycles* campaign was introduced, encouraging individuals and groups to cycle every Sunday starting from December 17, 2024. The nationwide cycling campaign has already seen the participation of over 1.7 lakh citizens, with cycling activities taking place at over 4200 locations, and the campaign is still ongoing.

- <u>4. Inclusiveness in Sports</u>: This component focuses on making sports accessible to all, especially promoting sports for women, persons with disabilities, marginalized communities, and supporting rural/indigenous games.
 - Sports for Women: Khelo India Women League was started in 2021 to offer opportunities to women for participating & excelling in sporting activities named as ASMITA League which Stands for "Achieving Sports Milestone by Inspiring Women Through Action". Under this

initiative, various Khelo India Women's League – are being conducted. As of now women leagues have been organised in 21 sports disciplines across the country. Total 1030 competitions have been organized for Women athletes with 114153 participants. This initiative has significantly increased women participation in sports across the nation and has provided ample opportunities to women athletes to compete, learn and grow in all age groups.

Fit India Movement 5. Promotion of Inclusiveness through Sports
		Sports Competitions and Talent Development
		Khelo India sports competitions is the platform to showcase sporting skills and overtime became a platform for talent spotting and providing development pathways for talented children to achieve excellence. The component has following components: 1. Sports Competition 2. Talent Identification and Development
		i. Sports Competition:
		Under this component, national-level competitions, i.e., Khelo India Youth Games , which focusses on athletes under 18, offering a large-scale platform annually for young athletes and the Khelo India University Games , which focuses on enhancing sports performance among university-level athletes are held for high priority, priority,

indigenous, other sports disciplines. In addition, the **Khelo India Winter Games**, are organized for winter sports in regions like Jammu & Kashmir and Leh-Ladakh; and the first edition (2023) of **Khelo India Para Games** have been organised which promotes inclusiveness by creating opportunities for athletes with disabilities.

As of now, 16 editions of Khelo India Games have been organized viz 06 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 05 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG), 04 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) and 01 Khelo India Para Games (KIPG). These games have witnessed a total participation of more than 48,639 athletes.

ii. Talent Development:

The component of Talent Development facilitates identification of talented athletes (Khelo India Athletes) and nurtures them through multifaceted support. The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks made by Talent Identification and Development Committee Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for training purpose. The KIAs who train in the Khelo India accredited academies are entitled for the financial support in tune of Rs. 6.28 Lakhs per annum and inclusive of Rs. 10,000/- per month as Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA). Total **2845 KIAs** are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around 306 academies have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

- 2. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies: KICs and Sports Academies were created to support better utilization of sports infrastructure belonging to States/UTs and provide support for engagement of coaches, etc. It includes the provision of maximum funding to the State Centres of Excellence and Khelo India Centres under the "One State, One Game" initiative. The emphasis is on upgradation of sports science facilities and sports science resources; providing livelihood to past champion athletes (PCAs), capacity building and Viability Gap Funding support.
- **a. KICs -** KICs are set up with an objective of facilitating training for willing children, providing livelihood opportunities to Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) as coaches and to augment the utilisation of existing infrastructure. A target of 1250 KICs is to be achieved across the country with initial coverage of one KIC per

district. As on date there are **1045** KICs notified across the country out of which **938** KICs are currently operational.

- **b. KISCE:** Khelo India state Centre of Excellence is an initiative to fill the critical gaps in the state/UT's facility by providing customised support through Viability Gap Funding towards Equipment (Sports Science, Strength & Conditioning) and high quality manpower (Coaching, Sports Science). In the current scheme, the target is to set up one KISCE in each state/UT. Currently, 34 KISCEs have been notified across 33 States/UTs.
- **3. Fit India Movement:** The Fit India Movement was launched by the Prime Minister of India on August 29, 2019, with the vision to promote healthier lifestyles by encouraging individuals and communities to incorporate physical activity and sports into their daily routines. Activities are being ensured across the country including UTs.

A). Fit India Mobile App:

The Fit India Mobile App (FIMA) is a distinctive platform enabling citizens to assess their fitness levels through simple tests and receive regular wellness tips with approx 10 lakh downloads on Android and iOS,

B). Sundays on Cycle:

The Fit India Cycling Drive is another key initiative under the Fit India Mission, aimed at promoting cycling as an integral part of maintaining physical fitness. The campaign was officially launched on December 17, 2024, at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi. During the launch, the *Sundays on Cycles* campaign was introduced, encouraging individuals and groups to cycle every Sunday starting from December 17, 2024. The nationwide cycling campaign has already seen the participation of over 1.7 lakh citizens, with cycling activities taking place at over 4200 locations, and the campaign is still ongoing.

4. Inclusiveness in Sports: This component focuses on making sports accessible to all, especially promoting sports for women, persons with disabilities, marginalized communities, and supporting rural/indigenous games. Sports for Women: Khelo India Women League was started in 2021 to offer opportunities to women for participating & excelling in sporting activities - named as ASMITA League which Stands for "Achieving Sports Milestone by Inspiring Women Through Action". Under this initiative, various Khelo India Women's League – are being conducted. As of now women leagues have been organised in 21 sports disciplines across the country. Total 1030 competitions have been organized for Women athletes with 114153 participants. This initiative has significantly increased women participation in sports across the nation and has provided ample opportunities to women athletes to compete, learn and grow in all age groups.

- 4. National Centre of Excellence (NCoE) Scheme: These centers provide world-class training facilities and coaching to nurture talent across various sports disciplines.
- 5. Collaborative efforts with National Sports Federations (NSFs) are underway to enhance **coach development**, implement **long-term athlete development plans**, support the **hosting of international competitions in India**, and **accredit academies** under the Sports SAI and Khelo India programs, thereby ensuring a robust support system for athletes at all levels.

		i. Sports Competition:
		As of now, 16 editions of Khelo India Games have been organized viz 06 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 05 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG), 04 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) and 01 Khelo India Para Games (KIPG). These games have witnessed a total participation of more than 48,639 athletes.
		ii. Talent Development:
		The component of Talent Development facilitates identification of talented athletes (Khelo India Athletes) and nurtures them through multifaceted support. The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks made by Talent Identification and Development Committee Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and

Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for

training purpose. Total **2845 KIAs** are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around **306 academies** have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

- **2. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies:** KICs and Sports Academies were created to support better utilization of sports infrastructure belonging to States/UTs and provide support for engagement of coaches, etc. It includes the provision of maximum funding to the State Centres of Excellence and Khelo India Centres under the "One State, One Game" initiative.
- **a.** KICs KICs are set up with an objective of facilitating training for willing children, providing livelihood opportunities to Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) as coaches and to augment the utilisation of existing infrastructure... As on date there are 1045 KICs notified across the country out of which 938 KICs are currently operational.
- **b. KISCE:** Khelo India state Centre of Excellence is an initiative to fill the critical gaps in the state/UT's facility by providing customised support through Viability Gap Funding towards Equipment (Sports Science, Strength & Conditioning) and high quality manpower (Coaching, Sports Science. Currently, 34 KISCEs have been notified across 33 States/UTs.
- **3. Fit India Movement:** The Fit India Movement was launched by the Prime Minister of India on August 29, 2019, with the vision to promote healthier lifestyles by encouraging individuals and communities to incorporate physical activity and sports into their daily routines. Activities are being ensured across the country including UTs.

A). Fit India Mobile App:

The Fit India Mobile App (FIMA) is a distinctive platform enabling citizens to assess their fitness levels through simple tests and receive regular wellness tips with approx 10 lakh downloads on Android and iOS,

B). Sundays on Cycle:

The campaign was officially launched on December 17, 2024, at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi, encouraging individuals and groups to cycle every Sunday starting from December 17, 2024. The nationwide cycling campaign has already seen the participation of over 1.7 lakh citizens, with cycling activities taking place at over 4200 locations, and the campaign is still ongoing.

4. Inclusiveness in Sports : This component focuses on making sports accessible to all, especially promoting sports for women, persons with disabilities, marginalized communities, and supporting rural/indigenous games.

		• Sports for Women: Khelo India Women League was started in 2021 to offer opportunities to women for participating & excelling in sporting activities - named as ASMITA League which Stands for "Achieving Sports Milestone by Inspiring Women Through Action". Under this initiative, various Khelo India Women's League – are being conducted. As of now women leagues have been organised in 21 sports disciplines across the country. Total 1030 competitions have been organized for Women athletes with 114153 participants.

		Further, under the Sports Promotional Schemes of SAI, detailed guidelines have been formulated for conduct of selection trials for all the sports promotional schemes in order to ensure transparency and fairness in selection of athletes. The details are provided at Annexure – II .
		Apart from above, the Khelo India Scheme through Khelo India Talent Development, identifies KIAs (Khelo India Athletes) across 21 Sports including Para-Sports, and nurtures them through supporting ecosystem in a Consent based approach leaving the freedom of choosing place of training to athletes.
		The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks laid down in the Protocols. In consonance with these protocols, a specialised committee namely the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC) comprising of Olympians, prominent athletes, coaches of a particular sport are deputed to competitions wherein they identify deserving players and compile a Scouting List. Athletes selected are called for Assessment Camps and a final list of selected athletes is prepared in line with the protocols and the vacancies. The final induction of these athletes into the Khelo India Scheme as Khelo India Athletes is done after the approval of all TIDC members and the Competent Authority. The maximum approved number is 3000 athletes, out of which there are currently 2845 identified.
		Additionally, the scheme ensures that training and exposure opportunities meet international standards by providing specialized coaching for Khelo India Athletes at accredited academies. These athletes participate in the Khelo India Games, which adhere to international technical standards too. The performance is constantly monitored by HPMs and HPDs. They also compete with national and international

	athletes at various forums, enhancing their skills and
	strengthening the country's bench strength for future
	national and international events.

Annexure – I (PDF File)

SAI Training Centres (STC)

In order to groom the Grassroots level/discipline appropriate age group athletes, SAI Training Centres (STC) are established in States where the sports infrastructure is provided by the respective State Governments.

Selection Criteria:

(a) Individual Events:

Upto eighth (08) place in Sub-Junior (including Cadet) and Junior National Championships organized by a recognized National Sports Federation and upto sixth (06) place in Inter-University Championships conducted by Association of Indian Universities, and School Games Federation of India during the current or the year preceding admission.

OR

Sports persons who obtain first three (03) places in the State Championship Conducted by the recognized State Sports Association.

OR

Sports persons who secure any of the first three (03) positions in the North East Games & National Rural and Women Championships.

OR

Sports person who has represented India in any recognized Championship/ Tournament by the recognized international federation concerned.

OR

The first three (03) position-holders of District Championships, Inter-Education District Level small Competition, Championships held by Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya, Navodaya Vidyalaya etc.; may be considered for participation in the selection trials.

b) Team Events: The talent who could not reach the minimum level of motor quality as per battery of tests may be provisionally selected for six months and only after passing the motor quality tests and specific skill test subsequently, formal induction may be made, if found fit.

Performance criteria for induction: Any member of a team which has obtained first four (4) positions in Sub-Junior and Junior National Championships organized by recognized National Sports Federation and first two (02) position holder in Inter-Zonal and Inter-University Championships conducted by Association of Indian Universities and School Games Federation of India.

OR

Member of a team which obtained first (01) or second (02) position in the State Championship organized by a recognized State Sports Association.

OR

Sports person who has represented India as a member of the Sub-Junior and Junior team in any recognized Championship/Tournament for which team was officially sent by the Govt. of India.

OR

Member of Winner and Runners-up in team games in the North East Games.

OR

Sports persons who have participated in the recognized State level competitions organized by State Sports Associations, State Sports Council, and State Sports Departments may be considered for participation in the selection trials.

Pre-condition for Admission: The admission in the above two categories may be made based on the performance indicators, Anthropometric measurement, Physiological & Psychological tests and depending on age, discipline, event and evaluation of future potential by appearing in the selection Tests. There will be no direct admission. The admission will be only on the basis of performance and battery of test result and are to be documented at the time of induction.

Lateral Entry: Those who achieved the desired performance in the District, State, National and International level competitions and successfully completed the battery of tests, technical and specific skill tests may be inducted at any time of the year.

Medical Checkup, and Age Verification is essential especially when admission is done on the basis of performance in the Sub-Junior and Junior level Competitions as an effective preventive measure against age fraud.

Extension centres of STC:

The scheme of extension centres of STCs was started in 16 disciplines to cover schools and colleges for wider coverage, with a view to develop sports standard in schools and colleges having requisite basic sports infrastructure and have shown good results in sports. The athletes are selected under Non-Residential basis for regular training.

Selection Criteria:

SCHOOLS

- (a) Individual Events Sports Event: Any of first four positions holders of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVs, JNVs.
- (b) Team Games: Winner or Runners-up of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVs, JNVs and qualify under Battery of Tests as per the norms.

COLLEGES:

- (a) Individual: Upto 4th place/ position holders in the Sub-Junior and Junior State Championships organized by recognized State Sports Associations, Inter-College Championships conducted by the University and State level SGFI Championships organized as per SGFI norms.
- (b) Team Games: Winner or Runners-up of District Championships, Inter-Educational Institutions District Level Competitions held by the Confederation of Public Schools, CBSE, KVS, JNVS and qualify under Battery of Tests as per the norms.

UNIVERSITIES:

Individual &Team: Sports persons who have represented University, State in the Zonal / National Championships organized by Association of Indian Universities and by recognized State Association/National Sports Federations

The performance of the athletes in the battery of tests and achievements at the time of induction should be clearly documented.

The athletes, who failed in the Battery of tests are provisionally selected and will be evaluated after six months for retention.

Battery of tests result, specific test result and performance appraisal record considered at the time of admission should be properly documented as base performance so as to compare the performance enhancement of the athletes periodically.

Pre-condition for Admission: The admission in the above two categories may be made based on the performance indicators, Anthropometric measurement, Physiological & Psychological tests and depending on age, discipline, event and evaluation of future potential and battery of test results and are to be documented at the time of induction.

Lateral Entry: Those who achieved the desired performance in the District, State, National and International level competitions and successfully completed the battery of tests, technical and specific skill tests may be inducted at any time of the year.

National Centres of Excellence (NCOE)

In its endeavour to train athletes to achieve excellence in Olympics and other International Events, Sports Authority of India has established National Centres of Excellence (NCOEs)

across the country to impart specialized training to promising athletes by providing state of the art infrastructure and playing facilities, sports science backup, individualized diet prescribed by trained nutritionists and overall supervision under the best coaches, qualified support staff and High Performance Directors

Selection Criteria:

Talent Identification and Development Committees of all the discipline comprising of eminent athletes, eminent coaches, NSF Representatives etc. of their respective disciplines have been entrusted the responsibilities to select/weed out athletes from NCOEs.

NSTC Schools:

National Sports Talent Contest, (NSTC) Scheme is being implemented to scout sports talent in the age group of **8-14** years from schools and nurture them into future medal hopes by providing scientific training.

Selection Criteria:

Individual/Team Events:

- a. Athletes, who are medal winners in State/National Level Competitions are admitted into the scheme, subject, to their being found medically fit.
- b. Athletes who are medal winners at District Level Competition or have participation in State Level Competitions are admitted subject to their being found fit medically and physically and also have the required potential which is assessed by battery of tests.
- c. For selection from the remote, tribal & coastal areas, the athletes are also selected by organizing competitions among participants. Selection is done by a selection committee consisting of representatives of SAI, School/ Akharas, SAI coaches, sports scientists etc. The sports persons identified on this basis are offered admission after age verification, medical examination and on found suitable by applying battery of tests.

Pre-condition for Admission:

The admission in the above two categories may be made based on the performance indicators, Anthropometric measurement, Physiological & Psychological tests and depending on age, discipline, event and evaluation of future potential and battery of test result and are to be documented at the time of induction.

Indigenous Games and Martial Arts Centres (IGMAs)

With a view to promote indigenous games & martial arts in the schools in rural and semi-urban areas and scouting of talent in these games for nurturing in modern sports this scheme was launched in November, 2001 schools runs by Educational Institutions having cluster of Schools like Kendriya Vidyalayas, Navodaya Vidyalayas, DAV, Vidya Bharati & similarly placed

institutions for promotion & development of indigenous games & martial arts were also included as part of NSTC Scheme.

Selection Criteria:

- a. Talents, who are medal winners in State/National Level Competitions are admitted into the scheme, subject, to their being found medically fit.
- b. Talents who are medal winners at District Level Competition or have participation in State Level Competitions are admitted subject to their being found fit medically and physically.
- c. The scouting of the talent in indigenous games is to be done on the basis of open competitions among participants. Selection is done by a selection committee consisting of representatives of SAI, Institutions, SAI coaches, guru/mentor of the concerned game. The sports persons identified on this basis are offered admission after age verification, medical examination etc.

Adopted Akharas

Wrestling has been a traditional indigenous sport in the country and mostly played at village level. India has won many international medals in the past and has been a force to reckon with. Therefore, efforts are being made to create a broader base for modern wrestling and supplement the efforts made by various akharas in the country.

Selection criteria:

The selection criteria of NSTC regular adopted schools is applied for selecting talented wrestlers.

Further, the Khelo India Scheme through Khelo India Talent Development identifies KIAs (Khelo India Athletes) across 21 Sports including para-Athletics, and nurtures them through supporting ecosystem in a Consent based approach leaving the freedom of choosing place of training to athletes.

The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks laid down in the Protocols. In consonance with these protocols, a specialised committee namely the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC) comprising Olympians, prominent athletes, coaches of a particular sport are deputed to competitions wherein they identify deserving players and compile a Scouting List. Athletes selected are called for Assessment Camps and a final list of selected athletes is prepared in line with the protocols and the vacancies. The final induction of these athletes into the Khelo India Scheme as Khelo India Athletes is done after the approval of all TIDC members and the Competent Authority. The maximum approved number is 3000 athletes, out of which there are currently 2845identified.

The Khelo India program provides comprehensive support to athletes, including scholarships, specialised training and coaching facilities, exposure to international competitions, and access to world-class training facilities, which entail funding of ₹6.28 lakhs per annum per Khelo

India Athlete (includes ₹10,000 per month out-of-pocket allowance for each KIA) as follows:

- c) **OPA:** Khelo India provides scholarships worth ₹10,000 per month to talented athletes, ensuring they can focus on their training without financial burdens.

- 2.Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE): Support is given to state facilities for filling critical gaps in equipment, providing high quality coaching, sports science manpower, all in an effort to nurture and support the children from across each state. Currently, 34 KISCEs are notified in 33 states/UTs.
- 3. **Khelo India Talent Identification and Development**: 2845 athletes in 21 sports disciplines (including Para sports) have been notified after being finally selected from various national championships, open selection trials, and assessment camps from Khelo India Games. A total of 306 academies have been accredited for the training of the Khelo India athletes (KIAs). Support per trainee per annum under the norms for the funding of residential Khelo India Athlete (KIA) under accredited sports academies is ₹ 6,28,400/-.
- 4.16 Editions of Khelo India Games have been conducted so far, which act as platform for athletes, including athletes from both urban and rural areas.

- iii. Purchase of equipment;
- iv. Sport science;
- v. Rs. ₹50,000/- Out of pocket allowance (OPA) and,
- vi. Any other support specific to the sports discipline;

Further, with a view to achieving the twin objectives of mass participation and promotion of excellence in sports, The Khelo India Scheme was launched on 14th October 2017. It focuses on identifying talent in rural areas offering them a platform to compete in national-level tournaments.

Several Key Initiatives have been launched or schemes launched under the Khelo India Programme to ensure accessibility to sports facilities for children in rural areas of the Madhya Pradesh. The details are as follows:

These centers offer a range of disciplines such as Mallakhamb, Boxing, Table Tennis, Athletics, Hockey, Rowing, Football, Judo, Badminton, Wrestling, Archery, Basketball etc. A total of 1342 athletes (675 Males; 667 Female) are currently training in these centres. **Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE)** ✓ State of Madhya Pradesh has 1 KISCE (MP State Academy, Bhopal) with 18 manpower sanctioned. ✓ These centers offer disciplines Boxing, Shooting Weightlifting. ✓ A total of 363 athletes (157 Males; 206 Female) are currently training in these centres. **Khelo India Accredited Academies (KIAA)** ✓ 13 Non SAI and 3 SAI (Sports Authority of India) Khelo India Accredited Academies are operational, offering high-quality training and support to budding athletes. Further, athletes are being provided with all requisite facilities and support. The Paralympic Committee of India (PCI), the designated National Sports Federation (NSF), is being provided with financial assistance towards training of athletes which includes all requisite facilities.

To ensure optimal preparation, this support includes: wholesome nutritious diet, food supplements, equipment support, state-of-the-art infrastructure, lodging, travelling facilities, services of reputed Indian and Foreign Coaches/supporting staff, scientific & medical support, sports kit, etc. besides financial assistance for their training and participation in international competitions in India and abroad through the **Scheme of financial assistance to NSFs**.

For the said purpose, an ACTC (Annual Calendar for Training and Competition) budget is approved for each NSFs every year.

Under **Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS)**, talented Athletes are being selected and provided Financial Assistance, which covers:

- i. Customized Domestic and International training;
- ii. International competitions;
- iii. Purchase of equipment;
- iv. Sport science;
- v. Rs. ₹50,000/- Out of pocket allowance (OPA) and,
- vi. Any other support specific to the sports discipline; Athletes under TOPS are regularly evaluated based on their performance. The details are provided in **Annexure I**.

Furthermore, under schemes such as **National Centres of Excellence (NCOEs)** and **Khelo India**, talented players not covered under TOPS are also identified and provided assistance for training and preparation, including a monthly OPA. These athletes are assessed periodically to ensure sustained performance improvements.

As of now, 25 KISCEs are operational, and 34 KISCEs have been officially notified. Additionally, continuous engagements with state authorities are being undertaken through regular meetings to streamline and expedite the operationalization process of
		the remaining centres.

		To encourage sports across the country thus allowing the population to harness the power of sports through its cross-cutting influence, including, holistic development of children and youth, community development, social integration, gender equality, healthy lifestyle, national pride and economic opportunities related to sports development.
		The Khelo India Scheme, initially focused on reviving sports culture at the grassroots level, has evolved significantly, expanding from school games to youth, university, and winter games, and now includes para-sports, with a broader focus on talent development, and inclusive sports participation.
		It is divided into five components:
		 Creation and Upgradation of Sports Infrastructure Sports Competitions and Talent Development Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies Fit India Movement Promotion of Inclusiveness through Sports
		Sports Competitions and Talent Development
		Khelo India sports competitions is the platform to showcase sporting skills and overtime became a platform for talent spotting and providing development pathways for talented children to achieve excellence. The component has following components: 1. Sports Competition 2. Talent Identification and Development
		i. Sports Competition:
		As of now, 17 editions of Khelo India Games have been organized viz 06 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 05 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG), 04 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG) and 02 Khelo India Para Games (KIPG). These games have witnessed a total participation of more than 50,000 athletes.
		ii. Talent Development:

The component of Talent Development facilitates identification of talented athletes (Khelo India Athletes) and nurtures them through multifaceted support. The identification process for a Khelo India Athlete is based on specific guidelines and benchmarks made by Talent Identification and Development Committee Based on the recommendation of the Talent Identification and Development Committee (TIDC), selected talent is identified as Khelo India Athletes (KIAs) who are given an option to join SAI or Non-SAI accredited academy for training purpose. The KIAs who train in the Khelo India accredited academies are entitled for the financial support in tune of Rs. 6.28 Lakhs per annum and inclusive of Rs. 10,000/- per month as Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA). Total **2845 KIAs** are currently getting supported across 21 disciplines and around **306 academies** have been accredited under Khelo India Scheme in various sports disciplines.

- **2. Khelo India Centres and Sports Academies:** KICs and Sports Academies were created to support better utilization of sports infrastructure belonging to States/UTs and provide support for engagement of coaches, etc. It includes the provision of maximum funding to the State Centres of Excellence and Khelo India Centres under the "One State, One Game" initiative.
- **a. KICs -** KICs are set up with an objective of facilitating training for willing children, providing livelihood opportunities to Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) as coaches and to augment the utilisation of existing infrastructure. A target of 1250 KICs is to be achieved across the country with initial coverage of one KIC per district.. As on date there are **1045** KICs notified across the country out of which **938** KICs are currently operational.
- **b. KISCE:** Khelo India state Centre of Excellence is an initiative to fill the critical gaps in the state/UT's facility by providing customised support through Viability Gap Funding towards Equipment (Sports Science, Strength & Conditioning) and high quality manpower (Coaching, Sports Science). In the current scheme, the target is to set up one KISCE in each state/UT. Currently, 34 KISCEs have been notified across 33 States/UTs.
- **3. Fit India Movement :** The Fit India Movement was launched by the Prime Minister of India on August 29, 2019, with the vision to promote healthier lifestyles by encouraging individuals and communities to incorporate physical activity and sports into their daily routines. Activities are being ensured across the country including UTs.
- FIT India International Women's Week: As part of International Women's Day celebrations, FIT India Women's Week was organized in collaboration with universities in 250 + locations with a total participation of 75,000 +. The festivities reached a grand finale with the vibrant "Pink Cyclothon," a nationwide event that united more than 25,000 women through cycling

The Fit India Cycling Drive is another key initiative under the Fit India Mission, aimed at promoting cycling as an integral part of maintaining physical fitness.
